Praise the Lord! Our focus in this edition is LOVE! What is love? I remember four types of love: Physical love (eros), Family love (storge), Affectionate love (philia), and Love of choice (agape). We will look at "Love" from two perspectives, as recorded in the book of Matthew 22: 37. "Jesus said unto him, thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind" (V. 39) "...thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself." So, I will break down the definition into physical and spiritual love.

Physical Love

Love is an intense feeling of deep affection for someone or something. It is also the feelings empowered by determination. It is not enough to say I love you if you do not put it into action, it will not be recognized. A person who professed to love football will reveal it through his constant practice on the field. In other words, it will be shown in his character. As it

was commanded by our Lord Jesus Christ, "love your neighbor as yourself," it has to do with actions generated through us to our neighbor and vice versa. Love is manifested by our actions and our actions are propelled by our determinations. As husband and wife, love between them at first could be spontaneous but will endure through determination. One thing is certain, true love never fades.

Spiritual Love

God is love. Love started from Him, and through Him, we know what love really is. In the way He expresses love to us, He is expecting us to do the same to Him. Our love to Him must be genuine and enduring. He commanded us to love Him with all our hearts, souls, and minds without reservation. God is calling for our total attention. The scriptures tell us in the book of 1John 3:1, "What manner of love the father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God." The verse reveals the action of God to love us, doing so voluntarily. We also ought to respond accordingly. Apostle Paul tells us in the book of Romans 12:9 (KJV), "Let love be without dissimulation," meaning we should exhibit love without hypocrisy.

Characteristics of Love

I will limit this to what was recorded in the book of 1 Corinthians 13: 4-8a (NKJV, NASB) it says:

- 4. Love does not brag
- 5. Love is not arrogant
- 6. Love does not behave rudely
- 7. Love does not seek its own
- 8. Love is not easily provoked
- 9. Love thinks no evil
- 10. Love does not rejoice in iniquity
- 11. Love rejoices in the truth
- 12. Love bears all things
- 13. Love believes all things
- 14. Love hopes all things
- 15. Love endures all things
- 16. Love never fails

Therefore, as we continue to serve the Lord, let us obey His commandment to love one another.

We need to visit these places and renew our beliefs, hopes, opinions and thinking to affirm that our present life is a privilege that is very beautiful. William James said, "Believe that life is worth living and your belief will help create the fact. But in all, never forget that the GOD-FACTOR cannot be ruled out as to how your life is positioned (Psalm 127:1).

So lastly, I leave you with this question; is life indeed beautiful for you?

THE STORY OF MY LIFE

It pays to serve Jesus; I speak from my heart,

This song speaks volumes about my life experiences before and after I met our Lord Jesus Christ, my Redeemer, Savior and most importantly my Lord.

My names are Hamdat Mojere. Hamdat is a muslim name because I came from a muslim family and environment. Despite the fact that my mom was a nominal Christian; yet the family was still traditionalist. I attended Islamic school briefly before I ran away. My mom was a disciplinarian and hard working woman hence, we the 5 children (a son and four girls), are cultured. My step-mother also had 5 Children. I am the fourth child of my father and mother.

As a young girl, I stayed with my paternal Aunt of a blessed memory. She was Christian, though not born again; she sowed seeds of salvation into my life. From my childhood I had this instinct in me that the hands of God were upon me, which was also confirmed by our landlady. I never knew what it was until years later. Despite this inclination at childhood the sinful nature manifested from my Primary days to Adolescent age. I was a chameleon type of girl, cultured at home but the opposite at school because nobody monitored me.

In my school days, I repeated classes once in Primary and again in Secondary school. My mom never knew since she was illiterate. I framed unimaginable lies. My siblings that could mentor and monitor me had relocated with our aunt to Ibadan. In high school I was brilliant yet never serious; I snuck out of school to play outside while others were in class. The funniest part is that I was the most punctual and regular student in the whole school especially at the Assembly. This earned me a punctuality award, but I was never regular in the class. As big girls, we were members of the School Christian Fellowship, but we also had boyfriends. However, the fellowship Coordinator never gave up on us. I wondered why and thank God we all became born again Christians.

MY CONVERSION

My failure to make promotion to the final class opened the door to my salvation. I became serious with fellowship, distributing tracts all over. Yet I wasn't born again. Precisely on December 12th 1976, God double crossed me during an outreach program organized by Gospel Faith Mission Church. It was Jesus' crucifixion film that melted my heart of worldly pleasure when the Preacher spoke about all the agonies Jesus bore for me. There I totally surrendered my life to Christ and later became a member of the church.

My life changed completely and my academic performance tremendously improved. This was the first testimony my family confirmed. Yet I was labeled a "fanatic" because of my passion for Christ.

LIFE AFTER CONVERSION

My new life became a great concern to my family who felt that my newly found faith was only meant for those frustrated or dropped-out people. Truthfully, at that time, some brethren were withdrawing from school with the anticipation that Jesus would soon come. When their pressure could not change me, I was rejected and neglected.

God stood by me throughout my college years. My aunty made a statement that I would soon renounce my faith and come back to them, but thank God they are the people joining me in my "Fanaticism," because they saw genuine changes and testimonies of God's faithfulness in my academics and behavior.

TESTIMONIES

I will ever be grateful to God because I serve a living God. There was a clear testimony when I had twin daughters as my first born after child bearing was delayed for almost ten years. I deliberately broke my first relationship of about five years when my fiancé backslid, I told him emphatically that I would not trade my salvation for marriage or compromise my faith in Christ. It took me about six years to get the man of my dreams out of many proposals. In my waiting period, I challenged God to compensate my patience for His will with twins which He honored. Because of my advanced age, we asked God to give us a son and God agreed to it again. God gave me the husband and in-laws of my dreams, because I desired a happy Christian home and I am very grateful for this.

Thank God that today I am the pastor and the priest to all my siblings by the grace of God. In the extended family, paternal and maternal, God has raised for Himself Children of the Kingdom; among them are Pastors and Missionaries, through passionate intercession. Like Apostle John, I have no pleasure than seeing my people walking in truth. I praise the Lord for His faithfulness and for many other testimonies that space can not contain.


CONCLUSION
