Resurrection - A Living Hope

What do we hope for? Certainly peace for the Ukraine, but are there other, more personal hopes? Hopes for this country? Hopes for our families? Hopes for ourselves? Hopes for our church?

As Christians, we have a unique hope. Most Sundays, in one way or another, we declare our belief in Jesus being raised from the dead; that He is the resurrection and the life. This week brings us to the end of our series of looking at the Resurrection this Easter and we move to focus on the promise of the coming Spirit celebrated at Pentecost. But before we leave this topic, we focus on the hope we have because of the Risen Lord.

The obvious hope we have involves our understanding of what happens next, when this life comes to an end. Because Jesus is the resurrection and the life, we believe that He, not death, has the final word. He, who is the firstfruits from among the dead, can bring us new life when we die. We will be like Him. We will be the same but different. We will be given new bodies that cannot perish and will be free for the aches, pains and hardships most of us face. This is a great hope.

However, in our passage for today (1 Peter 1. 3-9) we are told that this is no ordinary hope - it is a living hope. It lives because Jesus lives, having been raised from the dead. It is a living hope for us who are living today. In a similar passage in Romans 5, St Paul tells us that this is a hope that does not disappoint (5.5). It comes with God's love and the promised Spirit dwelling in us. So even if for a while we suffer all sorts of trials, we have a hope that this will grow our faith and a belief that the living God is with us through all we face. And even in the face of difficulties, we can experience an "indescribable and glorious joy" (1 Peter 1. 8) because of our hope in the living Lord. This truly is our living hope.

But there is, as ever with God, more. This living hope comes with power. Paul prays for the church in Ephesians 1.19-20 that they might know the power of God in their lives. He reminds them that: "That power is the same as the mighty strength God exerted when he raised Christ from the dead..." Our living hope is that the same power that raised Jesus is at work in our lives now.

Our living hope in Jesus gives us strength to live for today. Yes! We hope for what happens after this life, but we live each day in the power of the living hope, knowing that the same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in our lives. Alleluia and praise God for our living hope in Jesus!
