Preschool: I hope you all had a wonderful Thanksgiving break and were able to enjoy time with your family. These next few weeks are going to fly by! We have so much to do in that time period! This week we will talk about our traditions for the holidays. We will decorate our classroom and begin some of our Christmas crafts. Students will learn about the letter "s". With only 3 weeks left in the semester, make sure to make your payments. If you have any questions, please ask! Have a great week! - Miss Stacie

Kind: I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving! This week our main focus will be Reindeer. We will identify how headers, labels, and maps help our understanding while reading. We will also practice stating opinions on the use of photographs within the book Reindeer by Katie Marisco. During phonics, we will review and then introduce the letters Uu and Ll. We will continue handwriting practice with the letters Uu, Ss, Bb, and Pp. **Please review the following at home this week:** Rhyming, Counting to 30, Sight Words, and practicing nice handwriting on homework. 1st/2nd: Welcome back! It's always nice to have a break and eat good food! We're jumping into Christmas stories in 1st and 2nd grade! In 1st grade for the next two weeks we are reading several different stories that involve Winter holidays around the world, poinsettias, and Las Posadas. We will talk about main idea and key details to support that main idea. In grammar we will be learning about the h brother 'wh' and the vowel sound /ae/ but spelled 'ay'. We will continue to review verbs. The students are looking forward to starting spelling after Christmas break. In math we will continue working on our addition and subtraction facts. We will also continue working on even numbers but adding odd numbers too! In 2nd grade we will be reading the story called The Legend of the Poinsettia by Tomie dePaola. A poinsettia is a popular Christmas flower that students have probably seen and will now learn about! We will talk about cause/effect and in grammar verb tenses (past, present, future). In math we will continue counting money (nickels, dimes & pennies), measuring with our rulers (measuring line segments) and identifying angles in a polygon. There is a lot going on in 1st and 2nd grade! - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: Welcome back! I hope everyone was able to enjoy the holiday and the time off. Our class will jump right in and pick up where we left off. Third grade will have a science study guide over chapter 7 go home tomorrow. Their test will be Friday. Fourth grade will bring home their chapter 7 science study guide on Wednesday. Their test will be next week. Both grades will have math tests this week. Third grade will have theirs on Thursday and fourth grade will have theirs on Friday. Please continue to work on math facts with your students. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: I hope everyone enjoyed their Thanksgiving break! In Writing, 5th and 6th graders will continue learning about poetry before beginning their actual poetry unit. In Science, 5th grade will start a new unit on weather and 6th grade will start a new chapter on elements, compounds, and mixtures. In English, both grades will finish a unit on verbs. In Reading, students will read Ch. 11 & 12 in "Bridge to Terabithia" and will present roles on Friday. In Social Studies, 5th grade will learn about the Louisiana Purchase and the War of 1812 and 6th grade will learn about early explorers in the Americas. 5th grade will also have a states and capitals test over #1-30 on Friday. **7th /8th Comm. Arts:** Students will read Ch. 12-18 in "To Kill a Mockingbird" and will present roles on Friday. **5th -8th Grade AR Requirements** are due on Wed., December 14th. To finish on time, students should be ready to test over their 2nd book by this coming Wed. Have a great week!

5/6 Math: 5th grade will resume with the naming and writing of large whole numbers, perimeter, and division by multiples of 10. In sixth grade, students are working with mental division of decimals, simplifying decimals and fractions, and the nature of prime factorization. **Tests This Week: 5/6 Math: Thursday**

7/8: In social studies, seventh grade will be looking at several cultures in the context of inland trade along rivers. Eighth grade will be looking at the important battles in the American Revolution. In science, seventh grade will be looking at the formation of stars including the sun. Eighth grade will be working on the relationships between work and energy.
