Historic Hoosier Hills is a Resource, Conservation and Development (RC&D) Area - a unique local/federal partnership. We are a non-profit, tax exempt corporation registered in Indiana and are a 501(c)3 organization by Internal Revenue Service determination. We are governed by a Board of Directors, local residents who determine the services that Historic Hoosier Hills provides. Our federal partner, the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service, provides a staff coordinator, office space, and related support to assist us in carrying out our Long Range Plan and Annual Plan of Work.

Historic Hoosier Hills RC&D, Inc., provides services to nine counties in Southeastern Indiana which include, Clark, Dearborn, Franklin, Jefferson, Jennings, Ohio, Ripley, Scott, and Switzerland. These services are generally free and include:

- Serving as a non-profit, tax exempt, 501(c)3 umbrella organization for citizen groups whose goals and objectives coincide with those of the Historic Hoosier Hills Corporation.
- Serving as a platform for communities and volunteers to work together to improve the quality of life and economic viability of the region.

Grants for Submission



• Submit Form to HHH

- Try to submit form 1 week before HHH Council is to meet.

• HHH will contact you and let you know if your grant submission was approved or denied.

• If Grant Submission is Approved

- HHH **MUST** receive copies of the **ALL MATERIALS** submitted to grantor.
 - Grant Application
 - Application must be reviewed by HHH before submission to grantor.
 - All correspondence between you and grantor.
 - Copy of Final Report

• Administration Fee

- A 10% Administration Fee is charged on all new grants!



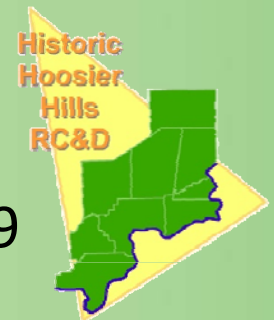
Basic Services Offered by HHH

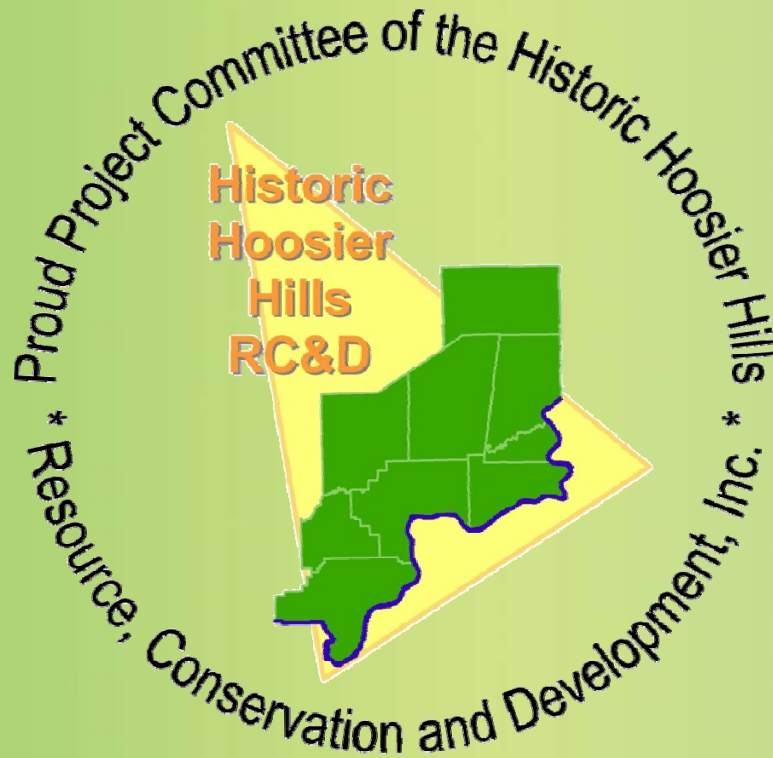

Our Name

The Phoenix was a sacred bird originating in ancient Phoenician mythology. The story goes that once every 600 years the Phoenix would build itself a nest of cinnamon twigs which it would then ignite. Both the nest and the bird would burn fiercely and from the ashes a new, young Phoenix would emerge to live another 600 years. It was also said to be able to regenerate itself when hurt or mortally wounded thus making it essentially immortal & invincible.

Many other ancient civilizations adopted the bird with their own minor variations into their own mythologies. Early Christians also adopted the image of the Phoenix to symbolize Christ's resurrection, immortality and life-after-death.

We want the association with Project Phoenix to symbolize one of a hopeful transition from a tragic event to a fresh, new start for the families who need our services.

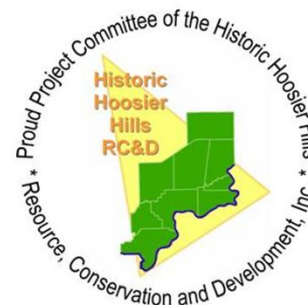

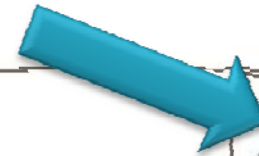
January SLC Public Meetings were a Success!!!
