
these young ladies have other 'showie' friends out there who just may be encouraged into the ranks of Shetland ownership.



Who doesn't love Christmas Cake? – I am told the secret is to get the right recipe. The recipe below is in the running for the tastiest cake yet. Thanks to Marianne Smith

Christmas Cake

Ingredients

1 cup of milk(8oz)

3 eggs (Bring milk to the boil add beaten eggs, stir until thick, & let cool)

2 cups plain flour, 225 gm butter, pinch of salt, 1/2 tsp mixed spice, 1/2 tsp cinnamon, 1/2 tsp curry powder.

Rub butter into dry ingredients (whizz) add 1 cup of sugar to dry ingredients.

1200 grams dried fruit, cherries, apricot, finely chopped up glace ginger or whatever you like

1 1/2 tbls Black current jam

1/2tsp almond essence,1tsp of vanilla essence,1 tsp of rose water (available from the chemist). Add to the cooled custard.

Combine all ingredients into large bowl then spoon into well lined 20cm cake tin make sure the top is level-do not hollow out centre.

Bake 140 for 2 1/2-3 hours. Leave in tin 24 hours.

Notes: line cake tin with 2 rounds of brown paper,2 rounds of newspaper,2 rounds of baking paper.

During cooking palace brown paper over cake if top is getting to brown.


Optional: when cold pour 2 tbls of grand Marnier or what you prefer over top of cake. I don't measure just pour!!!!

I use a butter icing flavoured with Grand Marnier

I have tripled the recipe using 10-inch square tin



Birchlands Crackerjack is a lovely example of the temperament of the Shetland breed that knows how to forgive and thrives in the right environment.

Penny Fanshaw, Birchlands Crackerjack's owner, writes:

My friend Hayley Sincock, who is a barefoot trimmer, rescued Birchlands Crackerjack 3 years ago. She met him when she was called to trim four ponies on the property where he lived. When she came to Crackerjack he was in a poorly way with his hooves in bad shape and having foundered. Hayley battled to get Jack (Crackerjack) and his mini paddock mate, Teddy, out of the place they were in.






My daughter rode him for six months or so at Hayley's grazing. We bought him a pair of hoof boots as he could still feel pretty tender on his feet as he had foundered before Hayley took him home. That helped him get out on the stones and gravel. The exercise changed his outlook. He was Grumpy when we first started working with him. Jack was pretty challenging for a learner rider too. He has become a lot softer and responsive for Jasmine to ride.

Hayley gave him to Jasmine about this time which we so appreciated as at that time we weren't in a position to buy a pony.

We had also started teaching him to jump which was fun, he didn't really understand what we were asking to start with. But



As Jasmine has grown she and Jack have developed a fantastic bond. He loves jumping and going out on outings, and trots onto the float or walks from our grazing along the very busy main road to Ferrymead pony club in Christchurch. He doesn't bat an eye or flinch at the big trucks. Jack has also turned his hoof to some first start eventing, pony club games - he excels at being short to vault onto! He's also done a couple of dressage training days, though not his favourite activity as his latest tricks are ducking out of the arena at A or jumping out over the pipes when Jasmine is having a lesson.

He's got a home with us for life. We feel so lucky we met Havley and Jack





He's been at the rare breeds display at the New Zealand Agricultural Show in November and Jasmine jumped him in their display area. Jack's also taken part in the working equitation at Equifest in Christchurch.

But send me to my rest with tenderness and kindness And my gratitude will be your reward – This I ask in the name of Him Who was born in a stable.






