Wordplay

Print, laminate and cut out these cards and give them to the pupils as they enter the room and you have a literacy starter.

Call out a series of numbers (4 or 5 is usually enough) and ask the pupils to perform what is on their card.

Alternatively you could use them to provide a change of activity in the middle of the lesson.

Which ever way you choose you have an opportunity to generate an engaging conversation in the class about literacy issues.
