1990 Annual Conference and Conference on Pidgins and Creoles

The 1990 annual conference of the Linguistic Society of Papua New Guinea will be held 27-29 June at the P.N.G. University of Technology, Lae. The theme for the conference is to be: Language and Literacy in Melanesia. As is normally the case, papers on other topics are also welcome. This conference will be one of three meetings taking place simultaneously, the others being the 3rd International Conference on Pidgins and Creoles in Melanesia and the 4th National Literacy and Awareness Training Course (see below). There will possibly also be a joint meeting of the Language and Literacy Consultancy Group and the Goroka Literacy Group.
