

General Information

Days & Hours: Monday through Friday, 9:00am - 4:00pm.

Transportation: PHC does not provide transportation. Children will be released to a non-family member only with written permission from a parent or guardian.

Lunch: Campers should bring a complete lunch and two snacks packed in a cooler or insulated container. Cold drinks, bottled water and snacks are available from our vending machines, and fresh drinking water is available from our water fountain. *We do not provide refrigeration*.

Equipment: A certified *horseback riding helmet* (must have ASTM/SEI sticker), manufactured after the year 2018 is required. Such helmets are provided by PHC at no charge. Absolutely *no bike helmets*! Other safety requirements include long pants and *flat-soled boots* with 1/2" shelf heel. *No sneakers* allowed in the barn. Please send your child with a change of clothes as they will get dirty/wet during activities. For safety sake, NO riding in shorts or short pants.

Terms: Reserve your place with a deposit of \$100 (**non-refundable**) for each week of camp you're attending - by cash or check (payable to Potomac Horse Center, Inc.) or with a credit card payment in person or by phone, and completion of our: -

Camp Participation Agreement and Liability Waiver. The final balance is due according to the terms of the contract in order to guarantee your reservation.

Health Requirements: If your Camper resides in the United States, a United States Territory, or the District of Columbia, all that is required is the Parent or Legal Guardian's completion of our Camp Contract and a Camp Health History Form. Maryland law requires that Campers not residing in the USA complete a Form 896, which is available from our office by request.

Levels: Campers with no experience, or experience with walk, trot and individual canter will be placed in our beginner program. Campers with experience cantering in a group (including dressage), or have experience with ground poles or jumping, will be placed in our intermediate program. If your camper is a PHC student, we will assign them to the appropriate program. If you are new to PHC, sign up for an evaluation ride for appropriate program placement.

Covid Protocols: We are following current CDC and Maryland Department of Health guidelines.
