

2022 REUNION

The coronavirus (COVID-19) has affected many aspects of the way we live in the United States and beyond. Some effects have been physical, mental, psychological, emotional, spiritual, financial and economical. And honestly, all of the impacts may be still unknown. However, it has been, and still is, evident that COVID-19 adversely affected farming, manufacturing, shipping, import/export, supplier and producer services in the months following the onset of the coronavirus in the U.S. It caused demand shocks and problems with supply chains, creating shortages in consumer products because demand went up and supply went down. The shortages drove prices up, plant shutdowns, a nationwide shortage of truck drivers, the inability to transport goods from one place to another, the struggle to move consumer goods to retailers fast enough, grocery store shortages, sickness and death of workers, the cost of implementing worker safety protocols and multiple other reasons specifically contributed to price increases. As a result, the financial impact of COVID-19 has made it more expensive for businesses to operate and they are passing those costs on to the consumer.

The alumni association has started the pre-planning process for the 2022 reunion. We have already been informed of increased expenses for reunion events. Since the reunion will cost the association more money, we have no choice but to raise the cost of the tickets for the reunion events. The reunion has been and must remain self-supporting. For our 2022 reunion, our alumni association's Board of Directors recently approved the following prices: the Package (tickets for all 3 events) will be \$100 per person; the individual Meet 'N Greet tickets will be \$30 per person; the individual GALA tickets will be \$50 per person; the individual Scholarship & Memorial Breakfast tickets will be \$30 per person. We are also anticipating increased costs in every aspect of the reunion including but not limited to the GALA, bus transportation, the reunion souvenir booklet, and the shirts and caps.
