I. <u>Introduction</u>:

A. Why is Moses an absurd candidate to be the redeemer of Israel?

B. What were Moses' first two objections?

II. Main Argument

- A. Skepticism (v. 1)
 - 1. <u>Presumption</u>: what does Moses reveal about himself
 - 2. <u>God's Sufficiency</u>: How has God answered Moses' earlier objections to this command and task?
 - 3. <u>Reasonable Objection</u>: Why does Moses' third objection seem somewhat reasonable initially?
 - a. Why is Moses' objection irreverent and impertinent?
 - b. <u>Application</u>: What are areas we doubt God's Word?

- **B.** Signs (2-9): What is the purpose of biblical signs?
 - 1. Staff: of what was the cobra emblematic?
 - a. How does Moses begin to display faith in God's word with the cobra?
 - b. What lessons are there for Moses and for Egypt in the sign of the staff/cobra?
 - 2. <u>Skin</u>: what lesson is there for Moses and Israel in the sign of the leprous hand?
 - 3. <u>Survival</u>: When God strikes the Nile, how is he striking at the source of Egypt's life?
 - 4. The Function of Signs
 - a. How do each of these signs display God's competence?
 - b. Since signs and wonders (miracles) are not designed to bring people to faith, what are they designed to do?

- c. <u>Application</u>: what is the basis for Christian faith?
- d. **Application**: what sign did Christ promise the skeptics in his own day?

C. Speech (v. 10-12)

- 1. <u>Moses' Response</u>: How is Moses rude or impertinent here as he offers a new objection?
- 2. <u>True Inadequacy</u>: Why is Moses objection absurd?
 - a. What is the danger of Moses calling God Lord?
 - b. Why is Moses objection about not being a gifted talker hardly believable?
 - c. Is Moses' speech actually significant?
- 3. <u>God's Sufficiency</u>: with what do our own inabilities confront us?

D. Somebody Else (vv. 13-14)

1. <u>Getting to the Root</u>: what is the heart of all Moses' objections to God's commands?

2. God's Anger:

- a. What does God mean when He declares that He is "slow to anger?"
- b. How does God continue to show grace even in the midst of His righteous anger?

c. Application

- 1) What consequences for Israel follow Moses' reluctant obedience?
- 2) How are God's comprehensive plans and providence a comfort to us?
