The Macallan Cask Strength

Since I was first introduced to the dram, nearly two short years ago, I've considered this expression to be my "quintessential" <u>Macallan</u> experience. Matured exclusively in sherry oak casks from Jerez, Spain that were previously seasoned with dry Oloroso for 18 months; this whisky is like Christmas morning in a glass. It's bottled at cask strength (60.1% A.B.V. on the label but I've noticed variation between batches), without chill filtration and is best enjoyed with a splash of water.

Fans of The Macallan and lovers of big, richly sherried Speyside whiskies take note: <u>The Macallan</u> <u>Cask Strength has been discontinued</u> in Ontario and, judging by the website, globally as well. Perhaps as

part of the shuffle within the product range, the heretofore non-agestated red mahogany beauty has now been re-launched as a 10 year old cask strength offering. Although I have yet to try the new formula, I'm left wondering "If it ain't broke..."

<u>Nose</u>: Without water, expect to be taken aback by a strong, concentrated burst of alcohol co-mingled with dried fruits, orange, and spice. With a generous splash of water, the nose becomes more nuanced and layered and you can actually begin to pull out some distinctive fruity notes like: apricot, raisins, plums and candied pineapple alongside buttery oak.

Palate: Without water, hot but by no means fiery with bright flavours of raisins, candied fruit, chocolate orange and hazelnuts amidst a warming woody spice mixture of nutmeg and cloves. With water this dram really shines as the spirit becomes smoother and richer by allowing the more subtle flavours of caramel and coffee to emerge.

<u>Finish</u>: At full strength, the long and lingering finish eventually settles into rich dark chocolate and a hint of wood smoke. The slight oiliness of the spirit gives the dram some extra "oomph" here as it seems to coat the mouth while simultaneously producing a mouth-puckering dryness and of course a wonderful numbing of the lips! A splash of water creates a better interplay in the finish between the notes of vanilla, coconut, smoke and spice before settling into the dark chocolate flavours which now appears much later.

Overall: Personally speaking, this was the best standard Macallan expression I've found to date. Aside from the delicious flavour, I've also loved the slight batch variation between bottles resulting in differing alcohol content (from 54% to a monstrous 61%) as well as shifts in the intensity of the bouquet. It is without question for me, a smart buy as it's reasonably priced at <u>\$99.95 in the</u> <u>LCBO</u> and it's the last we'll see of this great whisky. Purchase one to squirrel away and one to share.

Saturday 18th January, Hong Kong: Today saw the sale of a stunning rare 6 litre "Imperiale" version of the highly sought after Macallan M – the world's most sophisticated single malt whisky, contained within a beautifully designed and meticulously crafted crystal decanter, for US\$628,000 / GBP£381,620 at Sotheby's in Hong Kong.

M represents a masterpiece created from the collaboration between three masters of their crafts; Fabien Baron, Founder and Creative Director of Baron & Baron, Silvio Denz, President and CEO of LALIQUE and Bob Dalgarno, Whisky Maker at The Macallan.

To celebrate the conception of M and its global launch in Hong Kong, four 6-litre Imperiale decanters were specially crafted by LALIQUE for The Macallan. These are the largest decanters ever made by LALIQUE. Each decanter required the work of 17 craftsmen, including two with the prestigious title, "Meilleur Ouvrier de France", with each taking over 50 hours to complete.

Of the four, two will be archived by The Macallan and one has been committed to a private collector in Asia. The fourth, *Constantine* (named, as are the other three, after Roman emperors), uniquely features the engraved autographs of the three principal creators – LALIQUE/Silvio Denz, Fabien Baron and Bob Dalgarno. This highly collectable creation was made available as part of the Finest and Rarest Wines and The Macallan auction by Sotheby's in Hong Kong on Saturday, 18 January 2014.

David Cox of The Macallan commented : We are absolutely delighted at the generosity of the successful bidder of the "M" 6L decanter Constantine in securing such a wonderful contribution to a number of Hong Kong charities and at the same time setting a new world record for The Macallan. It is testimony to the craft, quality and passion underpinning the creation of this great decanter. It is a very proud moment for us".

The Macallan is one of the world's most sought after and collectable whiskies, sitting at the top of the auction index for whiskies and holding the current Guinness World Record[™] for the most expensive whisky ever sold at auction, in 2010 in New York, The Macallan 64 years old in LALIQUE Cire Perdue at US\$460,000 / GBP£288,000.

Silvio Denz of LALIQUE said, "This new world record at US\$628,000 / GBP£381,620 highlights the uniqueness of the decanter and the remarkable quality of The Macallan single malt. Its creation is a tremendous achievement due to the unprecedented size, weight and completely new shape. After the Guinness World Record achieved by The Macallan in LALIQUE Cire Perdue in 2010 at Sotheby's New York, this exceptional figure underscores the interest and value of such extraordinary decanters".

The Black Grouse Alpha Edition

The Black Grouse Alpha Edition contains a higher proportion of aged malts from The Macallan and Highland Park to the aged grain whiskies than what's found in the standard Black Grouse. Male Tetrao tetrix, (Black Grouse) engage in a mating ritual known as a Lek to determine the alpha position or dominancy in the flock by presenting the best display for females. Festooned with a black feather, the bottle and packaging of the Alpha Edition serves as a nod to the company's interest in positioning this version of the Grouse as a premium offering in the product line and was originally launched exclusively for the travel retail market in 2011 before becoming more widely available in 2012. We love the original Black Grouse, in fact it won our Battle of the Blends series, so we had no hesitation in sampling a new spin on an old favourite even if we were a tad disappointed to see it bottled at 40% ABV despite the higher malt content.

<u>Nose</u>: Sweet, rich and inviting aromas of caramel and dark chocolate covered berries with soft thread of dried grass and straw laden peat smokiness.

Palate: Medium-bodied and a touch oily. The dram opens with sweet flavours of toasted vanilla and caramel that gracefully usher in a gentle, balanced, layer of char and peat smoke. Once on the scene, the smokey element dominates but doesn't overpower and a light bitterness akin to a high cocoa content dark chocolate emerges on the way to the finish.

<u>Finish</u>: Long and smokey with soft drying tannin reminiscent of musty old leather.

<u>Overall</u>: A great example of a rock-solid blended Scotch whisky. There's not a lot of complexity here but the flavours are focussed, well-balanced and there's no forced grainy sweetness or accompanying heat or spiciness that can appear in blends within a similar price point. Doubtless, fans of the Grouse lineup will enjoy this offering and I can confidently suppose that both newcomers to Scotch whisky and seasoned enthusiasts will find themselves charmed. There's still a <u>sizeable stock of the Alpha Edition left in the LCBO and for \$54.95</u> you can certainly afford to keep one around for your daily dram and to serve to guests while putting one or two bottles away for a rainy day.

The shimmering gold 15 year old vibrant whisky offers a white chocolatey aroma with a fresh tropical fruitiness emerging from the trademark gentle, sweet smokiness Highland Park is known and loved for.

Freya represents the continuation of Highland Park's Valhalla Collection; a range of four unique whiskies taking inspiration from the legendary Nordic gods of old. Bottled at 51.2% ABV this limited edition whisky comes housed in the same unique and award winning wooden frame of Thor and Loki, echoing the fearsome contours of a traditional Viking long ship.

Gerry Tosh, Global Marketing Manager said: "Freya is the only female to feature in The Valhalla Collection and being a serene, spiritual and giving goddess, she brings a fresh allure and depth to the lineup. Her beauty and majesty are said to make her



utterly captivating and I think people might feel the same about this smooth and classy single malt. It is unmistakably Highland Park, but offers a rich, full burst of flavour that reflects this Warrior God's mesmeric aura and feisty dominant side."

Aroma: Almond and Madagascan vanilla shimmer in the distance like the *Aurora Borealis*. White chocolate followed by candied cherries makes way for a vibrant wave of mango and melon, riding upon a cloud of cream soda.

Taste: The heart of this whisky shines like a jewel, surrounded by fragrant peat. Orange peel, butterscotch and rose petals provide the sweetness along with orange blossom and ginger. Lively popping candy, lemongrass and tropical fruits are lightly shrouded in peat smoke.

Finish: Complex and beautiful, yet balanced and considered like Freya herself, the finish gives lingering spice and soft peat smoke intertwined with soft orchard fruits, toasted coconut and a light char, providing a rounded depth and allowing this whisky to soar.

To accommodate the Kitchen's needs and meet our contractual obligation with them; our members are requested to respond to the emailed invitation seven (7) business days prior to the respective dinner to guarantee a seat at the dinner. After that members will be placed on a waitlist.

- For these individuals the process will be as follows, using the Monday September 23rd, 2013 dinner date as an example:

- Dinner invitations will be sent out Friday August 30th, 2013. Please respond to me (rdifazio@cogeco.ca). I will then acknowledge that you have a seat. Please understand that if you do not receive a response you are not guaranteed a seat at the respective dinner. In such circumstances (e.g., computer glitches) please e-mail me again or call me (613-634-0397).

- Accommodation at the dinner will be guaranteed for all members who respond by Friday September 6th, 2013 @ 6pm.

Cancellation policy

- Using the same example as above, anyone who cancels anytime prior to Wednesday September 11th, 2013 @ 6pm will be removed from the list. - Anyone canceling between Wednesday September 11th, 2013 @ 6pm and Monday September 23rd, 2013 will be expected to pay for the cost of the dinner and scotch (\$60). It is the responsibility of the member who cancels their (or their guest's) reservation to find a replacement. If I am asked to find a substitute and one is available, then the member will be asked to pay for 50% of their dinner cost.
