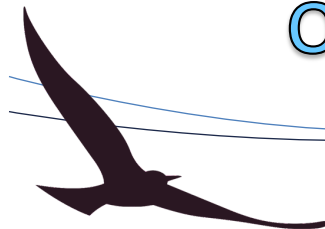

Bishop Trevor Edwards

Dear sisters and brothers,

Each week in church we pray the most dangerous prayer in the world. Regrettably sometimes we may parrot the words mindlessly and unthinkingly. Jesus taught us to pray - *Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name.....forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.*

When the famous author Robert Louis Stevenson lived in the South Sea Islands he used to conduct morning worship for his household and he always concluded with the Lord's Prayer. One morning in the middle of it, he rose from his knees and left the room. His health was always precarious so his wife followed thinking he was ill. "Is anything wrong?" she asked. "Only this" said Stevenson, "I am not fit to pray the Lord's Prayer today". This prayer regularly reminds us that unless we show a forgiving spirit, we cannot expect to be forgiven. In God's economy blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy (Matthew 5:7).

In 2019 when we visited our son in The Netherlands, we spent a very moving time in Corrie ten Boom's former house in Haarlem. You might recall she was interned by the Nazis in Ravensbruck concentration camp during World War II for the crime of hiding Jews. Her sister Betsie died in the camp. After the war she was speaking in a church in Munich, and afterwards as she was shaking hands with people she recognised a man who had been a guard in the camp. She heard him saying that he had been subsequently converted, that he had confessed to God the cruel things that he had done and that he was wondering whether she could find it in herself to also forgive him. Corrie thought she could not. It seemed like hours that the man stood there with his hand held out as she wrestled with the whole idea. With coldness clutching her heart, she knew what she must do and prayed silently "Jesus help me. I can lift my hand. I can do that much. You supply the feeling". So woodenly and mechanically she offered the forgiveness God had given her. As she did, an incredible thing happened. She says the current started in her shoulder, raced down her arm and sprang into their joined hands. And then the healing warmth seemed to flood her whole being, bringing tears to her eyes. She cried: "I forgive you, brother with all my heart!" Corrie had never known God's love so intensely as she did on that occasion. She was able to forgive as she had been forgiven.

What is our forgiveness like? Think how often and how much we have offended God and how he has forgiven us again and again. There must be no limits to our forgiveness either. If we have experienced the mercy of God, we must pass it on. If we keep it to ourselves, it will destroy us. In the church family there must be unlimited forgiveness.

Ephesians 4:17-5-2

4 ¹⁷ So I tell you this, and insist on it in the Lord, that you must no longer live as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their thinking. ¹⁸ They are darkened in their understanding and separated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them due to the hardening of their hearts.

¹⁹ Having lost all sensitivity, they have given themselves over to sensuality so as to indulge in every kind of impurity, and they are full of greed.

²⁰ That, however, is not the way of life you learned ²¹ when you heard about Christ and were taught in him in accordance with the truth that is in Jesus. ²² You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be made new in the attitude of your minds; ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

²⁵ Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to your neighbour, for we are all members of one body."

²⁶ "In your anger do not sin": Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, ²⁷ and do not give the devil a foothold. ²⁸ Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their own hands, that they may have something to share with those in need.

²⁹ Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. ³⁰ And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

³¹ Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. ³² Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

5 ¹ Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children ² and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.
