What is a "harp tasting?" It is a blind test that allows the audience to hear and compare the sounds of several harps. The test is conducted behind a curtain, so that listeners cannot see what

brand or model harp is being "tasted." One person will play the same piece on each harp, and the audience will try to guess which harp it is. Listeners will have evaluation sheets that they can use strictly for their own purposes. Since everyone has their own likes and dislikes, there are no winners or losers. It is all for fun!

The Pittsburgh Chapter is hosting a harp tasting at 3pm on Sunday, March 18, 2012 in the Aspinwall United Presbyterian Church, 299 Center Avenue, Aspinwall, PA. The church has a fabulous acoustic and an ELEVATOR to the sanctuary – no steps! The event is
