We hear that a lot, these days.

A church organist in Paris faced quite a challenge. He was 31 when the Second World War started, and he was conscripted into the army. His eyesight was bad, so he was enlisted as a medical auxiliary rather than an active combatant. He was captured at Verdun and taken to a prisoner of war camp in Germany.

He was a brilliant musician and in the camp he met a violinist, a cellist and a clarinetist among his fellow prisoners - so he wrote a trio for them! That work became a quartet: he played a badly-maintained upright piano in freezing conditions for the first performance in January 1941 in the camp.

Oliver Messiaen's Quartet for the End of Time is highly regarded. He returned to France later in 1941.

He resumed his duties as organist in the Trinity Church in Paris - he was there for 61 Years! He became a Catholic in boyhood.
