A note from Bishop Trevor Edwards

Dear sisters and brothers,

As we have begun to see in our sermons from James, one of his themes is persevering in trusting and following Jesus despite the challenges and trials we experience in a broken and fallen world. In the sermon I preached I suggested we need to avail ourselves of God's powerful guards to remain spiritually healthy and stand firm. Two that I mentioned were prayer and personal Bible reading. However, the sad thing is that the percentage of Australians Christians dailt availing themselves of these means of grace has been declining. I do not know what the next imminent National Church Life Survey will reveal about our habits, but in the United States the figure has dropped to 11% of adults. But if we are we are going to grow to deeper commitment and maturity in Christ and withstand the pressures we inevitably face as God's people in contemporary culture, then we need to establish or re-establish personal daily patterns of engaging with God as a priority. There are simply no shortcuts to spiritual growth and longevity, so intentionally listening to his word, meditating on it and doing it, as well as seeking his guidance and strength in prayer are absolutely essential. In that regard, I am forever grateful that I was introduced to what was called a daily Quiet Time early in my Christian journey. I was introduced to the Scripture Union method of both Bible reading and praying when I was quite young. Even though each morning I now use one of the Daily Services of our Prayer Book to give both structure and more balance to my prayer life, I have reverted to using the readings from their Encounter with God series again. As a result, I have really been moved in the past fortnight by reading parts of the book of Job about the real danger of giving uncaring, simplistic theological advice to hurting people in complex situations of suffering.

So let me ask you whether you have a personal daily Bible reading and prayer system that sustains you. If not, have you thought about using the suggested readings included every week in the Wavelength to begin to engage with God in this way and talk to him in response? Have you thought about seeing what devotional aids might be available in our bookshop to enrich your walk with God? Are you in a small growth group where you study the Scriptures and also pray with others?

As a church we claim to be a Bible focused community, but is our claim a reality or hypocrisy? If we really want to persevere and flourish as disciples of Jesus we need to recommit ourselves to these two disciplines which are essential for spiritual health.

"...Blessed is the man who endures trial..." James 1:12

Bible Reading

for today's Bible messages

James 1:12-27

¹² Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him.

¹³ When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; ¹⁴ but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. ¹⁵ Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

¹⁶ Don't be deceived, my dear brothers and sisters. ¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. ¹⁸ He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of first fruits of all he created.

¹⁹ My dear brothers and sisters, take note of this: Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry, ²⁰ because human anger does not produce the righteousness that God desires. ²¹ Therefore, get rid of all moral filth and the evil that is so prevalent and humbly accept the word planted in you, which can save you.

²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.

²⁶ Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless.

²⁷ Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.
