The Prophet was asked: "It is right to help him if he is oppressed, but how should we help him if he is an oppressor?" He then replied: "By preventing him from oppressing others." (Sahih Bukhari, Hadith 624)

Today in America, Muslims have been listening to music, whether it's haram or not. Not many people have thought about it, as it is very typical, considering people living in the United States.

Around the world, listening to music is very common, as many have a loveable obsession over it.

Many people don't bother asking if music is permissible or not because of its popularity, or others might not think that listening to instruments would be a sin.

Many Muslims believe that only vocal music is permissible and that instruments are haram, which is the opinion of many scholars, including the four mathahib (views of the 4 scholars, Imam Malik, Imam Ahmad, Imam Shafii, and Imam Abu Haneefah regarding Islam). All four of the mathahib approve that music is not permissible because of the Hadith of the Prophet Muhammad (SAW) where he states, "And of mankind is he who purchases idle talks (i.e. music, singing, etc.) to mislead (men) from the path of Allah without knowledge, and takes it (the Path of Allah, the Verses of the Quran) by way of mockery. For such there will be a humiliating torment (in the Hell-Fire)" [Luqman 31:6]

Music was first introduced during the prophet Sheath's time and that is the first time *fitna* was introduced. Many would say there is a direct connection between the two.

Hence there is a tradition of a cappella singing which is permissible as it does not include any type of musical instrument. Some Muslims believe that any instrument is lawful as long as it is used for the permissible kinds of music. This is often a common misconception between Muslims. Nasheeds on the other hand, are considered to be the halal type of music, as it is a genre of music that does not include any kind of instrument but, instead, uses a capella.

However, some Muslims don't care and will listen to any type of music, whether it was halal or not because they don't see it as doing something very disobeying to Allah (SWT).

Music, whether includes inappropriate language or not, is a distraction from Islam and the fulfillment of duties. The prophet SAW says, "Among my ummah, there will certainly be people who permit zinaa, silk, alcohol, and musical instruments..." Narrated By Al Bukhari.
