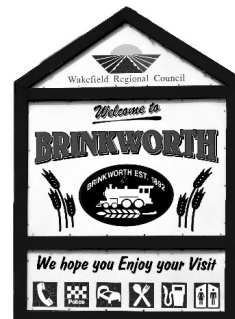

## SA HISTORY EVENT AT ROCHESTER 2 May 2021

Rochester, featured by the Brinkworth History Group was the focus for the SA History Festival event held Sunday 2 May. About seventy locals and visitors gathered for this special occasion – the unveiling of two signs telling a brief history of the settlement (circa 1869) and the demise of Rochester in the 1900's. As well, a cairn marking the site of the Post Office stone building was unveiled.

Fred Groom, President of the Brinkworth History Group welcomed all present including Geoff Brock MP for Frome, Rodney Reid Wakefield Regional Council Mayor, former residents and descendants of the Rochester area, local neighbours and visitors. Fred spoke of the difficulty preparing

the Rochester Parking Bay site to enable this SA Festival event to take place. He thanked adjoining neighbour Mike

Well, a bit of a quieter time for Progress these past few weeks but having said that we haven't been idle. We still have ongoing maintenance with the park etc.

Also, Grants have been sought for a fence around playground and I thank Jess Waldhuter and Rebecca Wundke for their help with this. It's been a big process but has been submitted so let's hope for a good outcome.

There was some talk of having the two events **Fair and Mower Race** held together though both events **definitely hold their own**. Because of the sound factor it would be impossible to have these two events held on the same grounds. Also, as it is a non profit for Progress, to have in our own space has cut costs down leaving funds for other projects.

Next year we only have one date to work with and had to lock that in with our Entertainment and Stalls which has been done.

As I said all the events held in April: Fair, Mower Race, History and RSL held their own with a good crowd. April is the best time of the year as everything else is quieter; Shows don't start Sport etc. We will always clash with other towns events somewhere. That happens with every event. We just try to stay away from big events as much as possible. We are open for any suggestions and input.

Smith for his support and time to make this possible. Fred also pointed out that the date on the two Rochester road signs were corrected before this event with assistance from the Wakefield Regional Council to read, Rochester Est. 1869 from Rochester Est. 1896. How many locals have noticed this correction? Geoff Brock, instrumental in dealing with the confusion of the responsibility of maintenance for the Rochester Parking Bay site then spoke in support of this project and encouraged the community to support keeping history alive.

Merve Dunstan, a past resident of Rochester was two years of age when he moved with his family to Clare, and together with Dorothy (wife of the late Ken Dunstan) were delighted to unveil the two signs and the cairn. The Dunstan family made their home in the converted disused hotel building after it closed in 1908 and made provision for a school to open in 1921. They provided a school room and a room for the teacher who boarded with the family. Merve's father Cecil worked for nearby farmer Walter Maitland. Merve then thanked the Brinkworth History Group for undertaking this project and for arranging the event.

After apologies were read Helen Weckert, Secretary of the Brinkworth History Group led an informal discussion about the settlement of Rochester and location of some buildings. Encouraged by the participation of visitors who had connections with Rochester, fascinating information was captured from descendants of past residents of Rochester (some families to mention are Hopkins, Woodhead, McCarthur, Beckmann, LePage and Dunstan) as well as input from locals and neighbours of the Rochester site.

As a result of this event valuable information in the form of photos, family histories and documents have been donated by descendants of families connected with Rochester and surrounding district to 'The Collection' of history significant to Rochester housed at the Brinkworth Museum.

Many copies of The Rochester Centenary booklet by RJ Noye, reprinted by the Brinkworth History Group were sold at \$8 a copy. It is a most informative history of Rochester and is available for sale from Fred Groom, Helen Weckert, Heather Hancock, Mary Robinson-Brand or Gilbert Welke.

From here we investigated the most cost effective option. What the blanket will do will raise the temperature of the pool and help to trap in any heat that is captured overnight and on cooler days. It will help keep the pool cleaner and potentially reduce chemical usage.

We are extremely grateful to the Lions Club of Clare for their generous contribution to the project. We hope by taking the chill off the water we will be able to see an increase in the use of the pool next season by a wider range of the community. .There's been good attendances on Saturdays so far. The course is getting pretty dry ( May.... hope June is wetter ! )and the roll is pretty inconsistent.

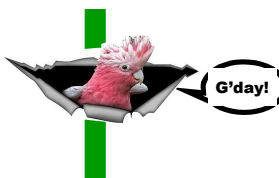
The positive has been the dominance of Meg Weckert in the winner's circle. Her enthusiasm at the club is really appreciated.

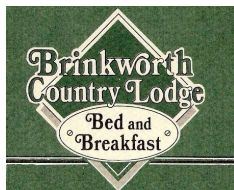
