BOOK HIGHLIGHTS: Contains the account of the widow woman's oil multiplying supernaturally to pay off her debt. II Kings 4

KEY STORIES:

- Elijah is taken up to heaven in a chariot of fire (Chapter 2)
- Elisha raises a boy from the dead (Chapter 4)
- Naaman is cured of his leprosy by washing in the dirty Jordan River (Chapter 5)
- Jerusalem is plundered by the Babylonians (Chapter 24)

KEY VERSES:

And it came to pass, when they were gone over, that Elijah said unto Elisha, Ask what I shall do for thee, before I be taken away from thee. And Elisha said, I pray thee, let a double portion of thy spirit be upon me. And he said, Thou hast asked a hard thing: nevertheless, if thou see me when I am taken from thee, it shall be so unto thee; but if not, it shall not be so. *II Kings 2:9-10*

Important Points about the Book:

- II Kings begins where I Kings leaves off.
- Chapters 2-7 cover the ministry of the prophet Elisha after Elijah is taken up to heaven.
- Chapter 13 covers the death of Elisha.
- The book covers the reigns of many kings of Israel and Judah, telling short stories about some of the most notable (good and evil). It ends with Chapter 25 and the Babylonian invasion of Judah with King Solomon's temple is destroyed.

2 KINGS 17

II Kings continues the history of the divided kingdom of Israel until their captivity. Israel forsook the word of God. The northern kingdom of Israel was conquered by the evil Assyrians around 722 BC and the southern kingdom of Judah was captured by the wicked Babylonians around 586 BC.

The book records the destruction of the house of Ahab by Jehu, the healing of Hezekiah, the wickedness of Manasseh, and the great revival under Josiah's reign. **II Kings 25:12-15**

Quick Notes About the Northern and Southern Kingdoms of Israel and Judah ~

- The United Kingdom of Israel lasted for about 120 years (1053-933 BC)
- The Northern Kingdom existed for 210 years (931-721 BC) before being taken captive by the Assyrians in 721 BC
- The Southern Kingdom of Judah existed from 931-586 BC, some 136 years longer than Israel, before entering into Babylonian Captivity
- The total kingdom period lasted some 467 years (1053-586 BC)

THE NORTHERN KINGDOM:

- 19 kings reigned during its 210 year history
- 9 different dynasties (family lines) reigned
- ♦ The character of was bad
- Prophets in the Northern Kingdom of Israel: Elijah, Elisha, Amos, Hosea

THE SOUTHERN KINGDOM:

- 20 kings reigned during its 345 year history
- 8 of the 20 kings had good character: Asa, Jehoshaphat, Joash, Amaziah, Uzziah, Jotham, Hezekiah, Josiah
- Prophets in the Southern Kingdom of Judah: Obadiah, Isaiah, Micah,
 Nahum, Zephaniah, Jeremiah, Habakkuk
- The Southern Kingdom kings were of one continuous dynasty (David) in spite of efforts of Athaliah, Jezebel's daughter, to kill all of the descendants of David. Only Joash survived.
