



NH General Court – Fun Facts

There are 400 representatives and 24 senators, making the General Court the 2nd largest legislature in the United States following the U.S. Congress.

- In the English-speaking world, only the U.S. Congress and British Parliament are larger.

The General Court is called a "Citizen Legislature" because members are not professional politicians but come from a variety of occupations.

- For their time and effort they are paid \$200 per term (or \$100 per year) plus mileage costs.

2022 Session – Priority Bills

HB1033, prohibiting recipients of state or local grants or appropriations from using such funds for lobbying.
 • Laid on Table

HB1365, allowing towns and cities to tax residential and non-residential property at different rates.
 • Inexpedient to Legislate

HB1570, relative to reducing vehicle registration fees.
 • Inexpedient to Legislate

SB252, relative to information on property tax bills.
 • Inexpedient to Legislate

2022 Session – Enacted Bills

HB1277, relative to the reporting of cybersecurity incidents.
 • Effective Date: August 16, 2022

HB1667, relative to the standard and optional veterans' tax credits and the all veterans' tax credit.
 • Effective Date: July 26, 2022

SB272, establishing a committee to study the oversight and operation of the public deposit investment pool.
 • Effective Date: June 7, 2022, with report due by November 1, 2022.

SB317, reducing the interest rate for abatements of paid property taxes.
 • Effective Date: April 1, 2022, applicable to taxable periods beginning on or after April 1, 2022.

2022 Session – Interim Studies

HB1641, relative to vessel registration fees.

SB250, enabling municipalities to adopt a tax credit for qualified private community property owners.

2023 Session – Filing Periods

HOUSE

- September 6, 2022 First day for incumbents running for re-election to file LSRs
- September 16, 2022 Last day prior to the General Election for incumbents running for re-election to file LSRs
- November 9, 2022 First day for all Representatives to file LSRs
- November 22, 2022 Last day to file LSRs
