- You will be making various star point units, center units, and corner units for your Ohio Star blocks.
- You will then mix and match these units to make your own blocks.

You will make 4 different star point units.

(The last two are mirror images of the same block.)



Here are three of the center units that you will be making:



They can also be used as corner units.

These center units are made using paper piecing. I will work with you step by step to help you with this process.



Here are some corner units that you will be making:



These corner units will also be made using paper piecing.



- After making the units you will combine them to make your own unique blocks.
- You can make a sampler quilt with several different blocks, or
- You can make a quilt using the same block throughout the quilt.

# Finishing Your Quilt

- You will combine the blocks using 1" sashing (for ease of construction).
- You will finish the quilt with a 3" border.
- I will go over techniques for these items as well.

- We will meet on the third Saturday of the month from 10:30-4:00 starting on March 20, 2021.
- Approximately a week before each meeting I will send out information including cutting instructions. Please have some fabric cut ahead of time to try the techniques.
- I expect this to be a six month program.

- We are going to try to record the instructional parts for later viewing on the PPQG website.
- Because of the recording and because not everyone is going to make every unit, you do not have to attend every session, and you do not have to stay for the whole session.
- That being said, we hope you will try to attend as much as possible so you can see and talk with your friends in the guild.
