The Wedding Wine ...

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding (Jn 2:1-2).

St. John the Evangelist reports Jesus' first *miracle* at the wedding of Cana. In contrast to today's practices, weddings are less frequent as many young people choose not to get married. Instead they move in together and become a separate unit. They feel that society has nothing to do or say about their decisions. In addition, a

solemn long-term commitment scares them. Setting up house together is their private business. If a wedding is considered, the costs can be exorbitant and many young couples prefer not to incur the expense.

During Jesus' time on earth, a wedding was a time of extraordinary rejoicing. The whole community was invited to the celebration that followed the wedding. It would last for days. The celebration signified continuation as the young spouses would build a family and ensure the survival of the group. Marriage was an alliance, a union of two families and therefore a guarantee of social peace and a reason to celebrate.

At this feast, wine was served to guests. As part of the celebration, wine would bring happiness, joy and acknowledgement that life would continue.

The story of Cana is not just the story of a celebration where the hosts ran out of wine on the third day. Also the identity of the spouses was not recorded. The story of Cana commemorates God's engagement with humanity as Christ resolved the situation and enabled the celebrations to continue without any further glitches. Jesus changed the water into wine on the third day. This was his first miracle: a sign that foretold his Resurrection. We are all invited to Cana to celebrate God's union with humanity! From now on, the water of our human lives will be transformed into the wine of divine life.
