(10/5/21) Reflections of Reverend Pamela Moyer

The last few months were challenging, and I wrote and preached about international, national, and local events that drove many of us to our knees in prayer, grief, and frustration. As the cliché goes, "we are not out of the woods, yet!" Wildfires are still a serious hazard, botanical, and financial loss. The Afghan refugees who escaped takeover are trying to unite with family, find resources, and settle in. Earthquake, volcano, and flooded areas are still in desolation and recovery. COVID-19 variants surged as hospitals found themselves in crisis mode again. And we recognized the 20th "Anniversary" of 9/11: losses and long-term illnesses of first responders. We have been praying for others even with our own concerns. And that is what we Christians are called to do. We draw near to Christ for comfort, yes, and also for direction.

Some have asked how can we help with so big a need? Paul tells us in his letter to the Galatians, to "2 Share each other's burdens, and in this way obey the law of Christ . . . 8 Those who live only to satisfy their own sinful nature will harvest decay and death . . . But those who live to please the Spirit will harvest everlasting life from the Spirit. 9 So let's not get tired of doing what is good . . . we will reap a harvest of blessing if we don't give up. 10 Therefore, whenever we have the opportunity, we should do good to everyone . . .(6:2, 8-10 NLT)."

And so we should share burdens. Budgeted Missions accounts do support groups who are helping in these big issues: ACCA, BWA, BGAV, CBF, and even the CROP/CWS walk will distribute resources to those above. We shared Dolores Puckett's life at an uplifting service with family, friends and neighbors, hearing stories of her generosity and "critters!" She donated many to us to foster until adoption. Amerikids preschool was a recipient; we saved a few for our Christmas Choir celebrations; and Pastor Ed Young's son-in-law's Motorcycle Club collects toys for children in need at Christmas. They are delighted to share them!

Resilience and flexibility are still needed as we slowly schedule activities. Young at Heart Gadabouts had two safe trips so far, and our Friends and Family Breakfasts are back on schedule. Advent and Christmas will be special music this year; concerts are cancelled until better immunity prevails. We are praying for our school teachers (David & Melissa) as they navigate strenuous schedules and COVID-19 exposure. Our church demonstrates healthy compliance, hope, and faith as we re-gather together. As we look to the future, we are committed to our relationships with Jesus Christ and to one another as our covenant states. Will you renew your commitment to pray together at noon, wherever you are?

COVID-19 news:

On Friday, Oct. 8, a Community Vaccination Center (CVC) — a largescale COVID-19 vaccination clinic —



will reopen in **Fairfax County**. This site is being reestablished to increase the number of high-throughput locations administering the COVID-19 vaccine across Virginia. The location is in the former Lord & Taylor store at Tysons, 7950 Tysons Corner Center, in Tysons Corner.

This location will offer:

First and second doses of both Pfizer and Moderna vaccines. Booster doses of Pfizer vaccine to individuals seeking the Pfizer booster if 6 months have passed since their last Pfizer dose and they are eligible to receive vaccine. An additional dose of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines for individuals who are immunocompromised.

The Fairfax CVC is organized by the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) in cooperation with the Fairfax County Health Department and the Fairfax County Office of Emergency Management. The site will be operated by Ashbritt/IEM, under contract with VDH.

CVC sites are intended to **augment** opportunities for vaccination. Appointments are encouraged; Walk-ins welcome. To find an appointment, visit vaccinate.virginia.gov or call 877-VAX-IN-VA (877-829-4682), TTY (711). Assistance is available in English, Spanish and more than 100 other languages. October 3-9, 2021, is Fire Prevention Week!

This year's Fire Prevention Week theme is "Learn the Sounds of Fire Safety!" During this week, help everyone learn the different sounds the smoke and carbon monoxide alarms make. Knowing what to do when you hear the alarm will keep you and your family safe. When an alarm makes noises — a beeping sound or a chirping sound — you must take action! Keep these topics in your mind each day this week!

- <u>Seconds Save Lives</u> do you have an escape plan?
- Do You Know the <u>Difference between Smoke & Carbon</u> Monoxide alarms in your home? Learn the sounds.
- <u>Focus on Smoke Alarms</u> have one on each level and push test the button once a month. Change batteries when clocks change. If it goes off, exit the house and dial 9-1-1!
- Learn more about <u>Carbon Monoxide Detectors</u> as heating season approaches.
