In the 2000's, it was a Food Pantry that sprung up from a grass root effort that continues strong today to feed the hungry. But today I want to talk about a milestone that has been reached. Five years ago a group of ladies embarked on an adventure. They took quilting to another level. After finding a pattern to make bedrolls for the homeless they decided to meet and try out this task. They begin to meet weekly and put together a sheet, blanket and quilt top. They also found there was a great need for these bedrolls. As time went on they found quicker faster more efficient ways to speed up the process. Using an industrial sewing machine was one of the improvements. I have had the joy of seeing them celebrate 100 bedrolls made, 500 bedrolls made, and now they have hit the milestone of 1000. These bedrolls are in Johnson City, Kingsport and Bristol. We at Edgefield are proud of these hard working ladies who used quilting to do something for the homeless. Making 1000 bedrolls was no easy feat. It goes to show what God can do when his people are willing to be faithful workers. They will tell you when material gets low the Lord always provides, as more shows up. Oh, and by the way they could use some more workers. I have been uplifted by the joy these ladies have for knowing they are making a difference. You can share in this joy. Thanks to these ladies for their faith and determination.

Zoom meetings simply do not work well for discussion of detailed financial reports. The really good news is that meetings have not been necessary as Edgefield continues to be financially stable. The congregation is to be commended for its faithful support and generosity during this difficult past year. While it is true that our tithing was down, it certainly could have been much worse. Our tithing loss was more than offset by a forgivable PPP loan (for salaries and utilities) from the CARES act. In a nutshell, we are in pretty good financial shape and continue to hold steady. I think this is quite an accomplishment given the difficulties of the past year. On behalf of the finance committee, I want to say "Thank You". We do know who receives the bedrolls, but we have been told that they been seen going up and down the streets. Most of us never venture in the downtown areas very often, but the need is real. The fact that we have never run out of supplies assures us that God has a hand in this project. Bedrolls from Edgefield have been taken to Good Samaritan, Manna House, and Haven of Mercy in Johnson City, Shades of Grace in Kingsport, and to Hunt Memorial Methodist's Proverbs House in Bristol.

It is a rewarding work, but we struggle with 2 problems; sewing machine problems and not enough people to tie knots. Pray to see if God is calling you to help. It is easy to social distance.

Take Your Children to Church

I remember Easter as a child. I remember the pretty new dresses I got to wear. I remember the shiny new shoes that glistened. But most of all I remember how important being in church not just Easter Sunday, but every Sunday was in our home. It wasn't a question of "Do you want to go?" It was the unspoken rule of our family. Because of that rule, I raised my own kids the same way. Because of that rule I have a church family today that I love and cherish.

Take your kids to church. Make the effort. Wake them up early. Fool with the belts and the buckles and the fancy hair bows. Endure the sleepy, grumpy faces and the misplaced shoes. Run around like a mad woman gathering everything and trying to get out the door on time. Hop to the car with a shoe in one hand and your make-up bag in the other. Give those babies a poptart and some milk and let them eat it in the car. If its raining, get wet. If its cold, get a jacket. If you're tired, go tired. But take those babies to church. You know why? Because Jesus is there.

He's there. And He'll meet them there. He'll be there in the smile of their Sunday School teacher as she greets them. He'll be there in the goldfish and the apple juice and the filling of their little bellies and hearts. He'll be there in the hug from a sweet friend and an encouraging smile. He'll be there in the sacred words read from the Bible speaking truth to their little impressionable hearts. He'll be there in the worship, the raised hands, the watery eyes, and whispers of praise.

So take them. Sit by them in worship. Open your Bible and open theirs. Show them how to find the scripture the pastor is preaching from. Show them how to worship. Explain to them why He's worthy of worship. Let them see you laugh and cry and praise. Forgive their wiggles and paper rustles and know that they're listening even when it seems like they aren't. Ask them questions and answer the ones they ask you. Introduce them to Jesus. Tell them of His greatness, his power, and his faithfulness. Tell them with your words and show them with your life. Tell them what he's done for you and how you've been changed by His grace. Tell them how they can be too. Point them to Jesus. Over and over and over again.

Take your kids to church. They'll love it there. It's the only place where they can go and just be themselves. They don't have to be good enough or smart enough or athletic enough. They don't have to perform for approval or achievement. They just get to go and hear how much God loves them. Just because He created them, they're valued and wanted. Their worth isn't based on the grades they make or their ability to throw a ball. Its not dependent on their performance or skill level. And they need a little more of that, don't you think? A little more grace and a little less pressure. A little more love and a few less demands.

Take them to church. Before you take them to the ball field, the dance studio, or the gym, take them to church. Let them know it's a priority. Show them it has eternal value. Let them see you set aside schedules, other activities, work, and business to be present with the Lord in His house. I promise you won't regret it.

Take them to church. I promise it's worth it.
