Programs

First of all a big thank you to all who managed to get to our June meeting despite the downpour right at drive time! Visions of last September, I am sure, were on many minds. The program presented by Lisa Ellis, "Healing Quilts" was a fascinating view of many ways quilts are used in powerful art installations in hospitals, cancer and diabetes treatment centers as an alternative to posters and plain walls. Lisa's workshop the following day, Cathedral Windows, was well attended and the project she chose was fun and mostly finished by all attendees! Our largest group of attendees for a workshop yet this year - 14! Remember the guild fee for attendance (only \$35) helps to defray the cost of bringing great speakers to our guild.

Our speaker for July, Pam Holland, comes to us all the way from Australia, via Albuquerque, New Mexico. In Pam's own words her lecture and trunk show "The Fabric of Life," will follow her journey of discovery through fabric. She will talk about where the fabric she uses



in her art comes from as well as her early beginning as a quilter buying fabric in the 90's from Debbie Mumm fabric and the

quilt shops to the fabrics she loves and uses today. She will take us through the process from the hot dirt plains of an Indian village and a rural village in Guatemala where they dye and weave thread for the manufacture of their fabric to a formal quilt shop and then on the to the final step of creating her quilts.

The workshop on Thursday, July 19, 2018 is titled "Sock it to Me". The class was originally developed as an online class, and while you don't have to do socks, Pam says they are "super" for this process. Whether or not you think you can draw, in reality all you have to do is to trace a picture, color it and then quilt it. As of this writing there are only 4 folks from our guild signed up, one paid. (supply lists available at next guild

meeting or via email if you sign up prior to the meeting) The workshop will be opened to other guilds on the 15th of this month if no more sign ups. Remember there are just 20 spaces available at Quilt n Sew. The guild fee of \$35.00 is payable to WHQG and guarantees your spot.

In August the guild will host Kelly Young for both the afternoon and evening meeting. Her book, *Stash Statement*, is the basis of her lecture and trunk show. In the workshop, "Structured Improvisation," on Thursday August 16, 2018 at Quilt n Sew, she will help all to begin the "Beach Retreat" quilt from her book. Participants should plan to purchase the book at a cost of \$23.99.

Retreat

The guild's fall retreat will be at "And Sew it Began, Pieceful Stitches", in LaPorte, Texas beginning September 28, 2018. The cost is based on the number of attendees: 6-9 \$150 per person, or 10 or more \$130 per person. Add \$65 or \$50 respectfully to include Thursday night in your plans. A \$30 deposit will hold your spot. You can start making your deposits at this month's guild meeting.

Also reminding everyone to patronize our local shops, especially, Quilt n Sew in Katy on Mason Road who so generously allows us to use their classroom for workshops and Bee meetings.

ABOUT INDEPENDENCE DAY

The Fourth of July – also known as Independence Day or July 4th – has been a federal holiday in the United States since 1941, but the tradition of Independence Day celebrations goes back to the 18th century and the American Revolution. On July 2nd, 1776, the Continental Congress voted in favor of independence, and two days later delegates from the 13 colonies adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson. From 1776 to the present day, July 4th has been celebrated as the birth of American independence, with festivities ranging from fireworks, parades and concerts to more casual family gatherings and barbecues.

Fun Facts:

In 2012, fireworks sales by wholesalers totaled \$482.6 million and sales by retailers totaled \$368.6.

In 2016, the United States imported \$5.4 million in American flags.

According to the Hearth, Patio & Barbecue Association, the Fourth of July is the most popular day for barbequing on a grill.


In 2017, the National Retail Foundation estimates Americans spent \$7.1 billion on food for cookouts and picnics to celebrate the Fourth of July.
