

2013 Opportunity Quilt



Strawberry Upside Down Cake

1 box white or yellow cake mix 1 pkg small marshmallows 1 small box strawberry jello 1 box frozen strawberries, thawed or fresh strawberries

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Butter bottom of oblong cake pan. Spread marshmallows on bottom. Prepare cake mix according to directions on the box and place on top of marshmallows. Mix strawberry jello with strawberries and add to top. Bake 35-40 minutes. Marshmallows will melt and come to top. Cake is done when a toothpick comes out clean when inserted in center of cake. Let cool

THE QUILT

I gazed upon my own life and was disheartened. My Angel was sewing the ragged pieces of cloth together, threadbare and empty, like binding air. Finally the time came when each life was to be displayed, held up to the light, the scrutiny of truth. The others rose, each in turn, holding up their tapestries. So filled their lives had been.

My Angel looked upon me, and nodded for me to rise. My gaze dropped to the ground in shame. I hadn't had all the earthly fortunes. I had love in my life, and laughter. But there had also been trials of illness and death, and false accusations that took from me my world as I knew it. I had to start over many times. He said, "Every time you gave over your life to Me, it became My life, My hardships, and My struggles. Each point of light in your life is when you stepped aside and let Me shine through, until there was more of Me than there was of you."
