## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

We have begun our Lenten Season and thus are called to conversion. For many years I asked myself about the word conversion. It is used a lot in the Church but what is exactly and how does it apply to my life. Conversion comes from the Greek word *metanoia* and from the Hebrew *Teshuba*. In Greek this word means to do a U-turn, to recalculate and in Hebrew it means to return. Thus, we can conclude that this word means to pause in our lives, recalculate where we are going, do a U-turn and come back to where we are called to be. To help us, the Church always places on the first week of Lent the Gospel of the temptations; this year we read Luke. The Temptations always place us in front of a reality that is threefold. First, where are your placing your securities, expressed in the bread – wanting to have things secured like food (what are we going to eat, to wear... how are we paying). Second, where is our reality, expressed in wanting to change the life we have (to try to make spouse, children, job, boss, ourselves different). Finally, what are our ideals or ultimate truth, expressed in what are we willing to sacrifice for those ideals (also known as idols). For this reason, we have Lent, so that we can stop and realize where we are so that we can return to the Lord.

I truly invite you to live this Lent. Use the tools that the Church is giving us. For example, participate in the Rice Bowl campaign, come the penance celebration of Monday March 7 at 7 PM, participate in the Synod, contribute towards the Annual Appeal, and come the Adult and Youth Catecheses starting March 22.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Hemos comenzado nuestro Tiempo de Cuaresma y por eso estamos llamados a la conversión. Durante muchos años me pregunté sobre la palabra conversión. Se usa mucho en la Iglesia, pero qué es exactamente y cómo se aplica a mi vida. Conversión proviene de la palabra griega *metanoia* y del hebreo *Teshuvá*. En griego esta palabra significa dar vuelta en U, recalcular y en hebreo significa volver. Así, podemos concluir que esta palabra significa hacer una pausa en nuestra vida, recalcular hacia dónde vamos, dar un giro en U y volver a donde estamos llamados a estar. Para ayudarnos, la Iglesia pone siempre en la primera semana de Cuaresma el Evangelio de las tentaciones; este año leemos a Lucas. Las Tentaciones siempre nos sitúan frente a una realidad que es triple. Primero, ¿dónde estás poniendo tus valores, expresados en el pan, queriendo tener cosas aseguradas como la comida (qué vamos a comer, a vestirnos... cómo vamos a pagar). Segundo, dónde está nuestra realidad, expresada en querer cambiar la vida que tenemos (tratar de hacer diferente a la pareja, a los hijos, al trabajo, al jefe, a nosotros mismos). Finalmente, cuáles son nuestros ideales o verdad última, expresada en lo que estamos dispuestos a sacrificar por esos ideales (también conocidos como ídolos). Por eso tenemos la Cuaresma, para que nos detengamos y nos demos cuenta de dónde estamos para volver al Señor.

Los invito de verdad a vivir esta Cuaresma. Utilizar las herramientas que la Iglesia nos está dando. Por ejemplo, participe en la campaña del Plato de Arroz, venga a la celebración de penitencia del lunes 7 de marzo a las 7 p. m., participe en el Sínodo, contribuya a la Llamada Anual y venga a las Catequesis de Adultos y Jóvenes a partir del 22 de marzo.

Caros irmãos e irmãs

Iniciamos o nosso tempo quaresmal e por isso somos chamados à conversão. Por muitos anos me perguntei sobre a palavra conversão. É muito usado na Igreja, mas o que é exatamente e como se aplica à minha vida. Conversão vem da palavra grega *metanoia* e do hebraico *Teshuba*. Em grego esta palavra significa fazer uma inversão de marcha, recalcular e em hebraico significa voltar. Para nos ajudar, a Igreja sempre coloca na primeira semana da Quaresma o Evangelho das tentações; este ano lemos Lucas. As Tentações sempre nos colocam diante de uma realidade tríplice. Primeiro, onde você está colocando suas garantias, expressas no pão – querendo ter coisas seguras como comida (o que vamos comer, vestir... como vamos pagar). Em segundo lugar, onde está a nossa realidade, expressa em querer mudar a vida que temos (para tentar fazer diferente cônjuge, filhos, emprego, chefe, nós mesmos). Finalmente, quais são os nossos ideais ou verdade última, expressos no que estamos dispostos a sacrificar por esses ideais (também conhecidos como ídolos). Por isso, temos a Quaresma, para que possamos parar e perceber onde estamos para podermos voltar ao Senhor.

Convido-vos verdadeiramente a viver esta Quaresma. Use as ferramentas que a Igreja está nos dando. Por exemplo, participe da campanha da Tigela de Arroz, venha a celebração da penitência de segunda-feira, 7 de março, às 19h, participe do Sínodo, contribua para o Chamado Anual e venha as Catequeses para Adultos e Jovens a partir de 22 de março.




