#### Pastor's Pen

Dear Members and Friends of The Vine Fellowship Church:

I don't know about you, but I am getting tired- tired of this virus; tired of what has happened with our national politics; tired of being so short with my wife, Margaret and Margaret with me and falling back on the excuse of the pandemic; tired of not being with family and friends; tired of being tired. And the weather in northeast Ohio doesn't help, right?

So, what do you do when you are tired in a lot of areas of your life? At a recent Zoom Copley Chamber of Commerce meeting, we were discussing topics to address in 2021 that would be helpful to the various business folks who were on the computer screen. People were talking about having someone speak to mental health (mind); people were talking about the importance of staying physically active (body); and, after a time, I spoke up and said something like, "putting on my pastor's hat and from my perspective, and being sensitive that some might not agree, there is a spiritual component to all of this. I believe body, mind and spirit are intertwined and when one of these areas gets out of whack, it affects the other two." And that is when a staff person from one of the nursing homes (that happens to be affiliated with a Christian denomination) spoke up and affirmed what I was saying. And then other people chimed in and affirmed what I was saying.

So how are you doing taking care of your body, mind, and spirit? It is not always easy to address the body during the cold winter months but bundling up and getting outside for a walk, regardless of the temperature, or going to the gym or walking on a treadmill or riding an exercise bike, lifting weights or using exercise bands can all help our bodies. Setting aside time each day for the reading of scripture, prayer and meditation can help our spirit. What you watch on TV and read; how you spend your time; communicating with people via phone, texting, emailing, or zooming; having a set time when you go to bed and when you get up can have an impact on your mind. Not to mention how much time you spend on the computer via Facebook, Zoom, searching through Google, twitter, texting, and any other technical way you can spend hours upon hours of your time to the point that you do not even realize.

Yes, body, mind, and spirit are intertwined together and how we take care of all three can make all the difference in our relationship with God and with each other. And if you don't believe me, just ask my wife.

I leave you with this passage from scripture from Paul's letter to the Thessalonians where he writes, "May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ". (I Thessalonians 5;23) Have a good month of February and know that I pray for you daily.

### **Update: Beirut Hope Project**

On August 4, 2020 at approximately 11 a.m. EDT, a terrible explosion occurred at the Port of Beirut. 204 people died; 7,500 were injured; the cost in property damage was US\$15 billion; 300,000 people were left homeless.

Our church, along with other churches in Eastminster Presbytery, contributed to the Beirut Hope Project. What follows is a report the **Beirut Hope Project** from Georges Ziadeh, Executive Director of the Compassion Protestant Society (CPS).

CPS is the diaconal (social services) arm of NESSL, organized as a nonprofit organization. After the devastating explosion in the Port of Beirut in August 2020, CPS created Beirut Hope Project to respond to the immediate needs of people whose homes were destroyed in the blast.

The goal for Beirut Hope Project is to provide financial assistance to 1,000 families to assist with repairing their apartment, house, or business through grants of \$1,000 per household. So far, \$225,000 has been raised and almost 200 families have received

financial assistance. Funds are provided as a debit card so that families may purchase what they need.

Beneficiaries of the Beirut Hope grants are mainly Protestant families referred by Beirut churches to CPS and from another organization organized specifically to respond to the blast. The explosion in the Port of Beirut in August affected mainly the Christian area of the city, displacing 350,000 people and destroying or damaging 63,000 homes/apartments and 40,000 restaurants, hospitals, and institutions.

# January Encouragement

January is already over and here we are at the beginning of February just TWO WEEKS away from Ash Wednesday which leads us into Lent and then Holy Week. I feel like I am just catching my breath from the Christmas Eve service and it's already time to start planning music for the Easter season. I was thinking about Ash Wednesday and the things that people give up for Lent. I thought....hmmm, what in the world are we going to "give up" this year?? What's left to give up?? We've given up everything from in person church, eating out, shopping, in person school, office cubicles....even shaking hands and hugging for goodness sakes!! Each year, during the Ash Wednesday service we sing "Create in Me a Clean Heart". So, as I was thinking about the words to that song, I thought "there it is.
