

"I'm a registrar in the A&E department of a big inner-city hospital in London. The patients don't know I'm a nun. It's of no importance when I treat them. Only rarely does it come in useful. For example, once when I couldn't get a priest for a dying patient, I offered to say a prayer with him and he was very happy. But I'd never suggest it of my own accord.

Absolutely not! I would consider that intrusive."

That's the opening paragraph of the third in a series in "The Tablet" that explores the richness and diversity of the paths taken by women Religious.

Sister Simone Herrman account of her German background and how she was led to discover vocation is interesting. Then instead of going back to Africa she was asked to go to London! The sisters wanted her to help set up a community for younger sisters from all over the worlds they could experience how it is to live together as women coming from different cultures. At present there are four: two Indians, a Filipina and a German.

She tells of how the community works and prays together, and how it resolves any problems within the community..

In A&E she specialises in working with the homeless. Often they come in with additional problems, like a drug or alcohol addiction, mental health issues, no housing and no GP. So they have a dedicated homeless team in-house.

She speaks of the mission of the Church and of her calling, and of her faith. "My faith gives me the conviction that there are no hopeless cases."
