Sahel

The Sahel region of West Africa is home to more than 18 million people. The same land has suffered from environmental issues such as erratic rains, poor harvests and recurring drought. Combined with the rising food costs, food shortages have swept across the region, affecting countries like Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger, Cameroon and Senegal. This humanitarian crisis has now risen to epic proportions and it is the children who are feeling the worst of it. Not only do they go hungry, but migrations leave them vulnerable to disease and traffickers as well.

Malaria

This is a problem that affects not one country, but many. In fact, one child dies every sixty seconds from malaria. Because of their weaker immune systems, the young are particularly susceptible to contracting it, but the sad truth is that malaria is a

treatable and even preventable disease. Plan Canada cannot stand by while thousands of children continue to die of a disease that can be avoided.

Malaria is transmitted through mosquito bites. The infected mosquitos breed in water and thrive in humid temperatures. With this in mind, Plan Canada has taken measures to reduce the spread of malaria and raise awareness on the effects of malaria in communities. Through its offices in Liberia, Zimbabwe and Guinea, Plan has distributed over a million long-lasting anti-malaria bed nets in 5 different counties; provided the resources to allow Nearly 590,000 homes to be sprayed with indoor insecticide spray, protecting over 840,000 people; and provided training for hundreds of community volunteers in order to have malaria awareness activities conducted at the community level. Since 2000, malaria mortality rates have fallen by 25% around the world and by 33% in Africa. As a result, 1.1 million malaria deaths have been prevented globally.
