The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), through the Commission for Justice and Peace, released a statement entitled [Poverty in Canada: Ensuring Safe, Secure and Affordable Housing](#) in anticipation of the Third World Day of the Poor to be held on 17 November, 2019. Poverty is a serious issue not only in developing countries, but also in Canada. The statement presents a brief overview of poverty in Canada today, with a focus on the current housing crisis, and provides a short list of some key Catholic organizations engaged in the alleviation of poverty in our country. The Catholic Bishops of Canada call for collaboration between charitable organizations, all levels of government, and dioceses/eparchies, as well as local parishes, to support individuals who are in need.

Reflection for the separated/divorced

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, so far from my cries of anguish? My God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer, by night but I find no rest. – Psalms 22:1-2, NIV

Meditate on the crucifix and remember that Christ knows what it is like to feel as though the Father doesn't hear your cries or understand your pain. Allow Christ to join in your pain.

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) - November 3rd, 2019

Life can change in an instant

We know the story of Zacchaeus, the curious tax collector who climbed a tree to get a better view of Christ. Instead, Christ saw him and called him down from his lofty perch.

The other Scriptural readings for this Sunday prepare us with biblical bookmarks prior to the Gospel. The word *today* appears prominently : *Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today* (Lk 19:5). *Today salvation has come to this house* (Lk 19:9).

Saint Paul reports another *today*, this time more disturbing. The term *day of the Lord*, was understood as the day of Christ's return, which many people understood as the end of time.

The Thessalonians were concerned and feared that day. We read in the Book of Revelation many disturbing images of the end of time. Yet the Thessalonians were not the only ones to be alarmed. St. Paul's letter resonates with what we experience *today*: global warming, ecological disasters, melting glaciers, scandals in the Church and a loss of faith.

In our modern context, St. Paul's words are astonishingly up-to-date: *We beg you brothers and sisters, not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed, either by spirit or by word or by letter* (2 Thessalonians 2:2).

Christ is our partner in our threatened world. He reached out to people and changed the dynamics. He went to Zacchaeus' home and scandalized the society of his day by dining with a tax collector.

God supports us with his inclusive mercy and acknowledges our deficiencies as we read in the Book of Wisdom. God's words reached out to sinners and had a tremendous effect on Zacchaeus who realized that salvation had come to his home. Zacchaeus discovered the joy of sharing and became responsible for how he communicated and dealt with others. His new perspective on life made him a changed person.

Curiosity and knowledge are the keys to conversion and the impetus to save our planet. As we read about Zacchaeus who climbed up a sycamore for a better view, St. Luke reminds us that salvation will come to those who are curious about Jesus.

How curious are we about Christ?
