**11:00 a.m. - Holy Mass - Traditional Rite - Mass Book, page 13.**

*Mass intention: For all parishioners living and dead.*

**ENTRANCE HYMN** (Deuteronomy 6:5; 1 John 4:21)

*Priest:* Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart,  
and with all your soul, and with all your strength.

*Priest:* No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and his love is brought to perfection in us.

**All: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.**

**GOSPEL:** Matthew 22:34-40

*Priest:* A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew

**All: Glory be to You, Lord!**

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a scholar of the law tested him by asking, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

*Priest:* This is the Gospel of the Lord.

**All: Praise be to You, Lord Jesus Christ.**

1. You were made in God's image and likeness, and every good thing you have comes from God. What does God ask in return? Whatever your answer, is it always easy? Discuss whether "love your neighbor" includes your arrogant neighbor or just your kind neighbor.

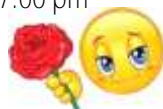
