LIVES CHARACTERISED BY JUSTICE AND INTEGRITY!

Our Sunday Readings this weekend speak of the importance of 'practicing justice' which is what God wants of those who profess faith in Him. The chosen people in the time of Isaiah had forgotten what was important. When people ask us what it means to be Catholic, perhaps the natural thing is to speak in terms of religious faith and practice: Prayer, Mass, the Sacraments. Beneath those religious expressions must be a desire for justice, which simply means living as God expects, doing as God wants. It means welcoming God's unsettling message, not seeking to silence God's messengers. It means looking not just at the quality of our religious practices, but at how these are reflected in our lifestyles. It means allowing the word of God to confront our lives, to influence our choices, to challenge our attitudes and prejudices, to expose our selfishness, to question our commitments and relationships. *If we desire to belong to God's Kingdom, our lives should be characterised by justice and integrity*. So, the question we need to answer is whether a passion for justice is a hallmark of our lives, as individuals and as a community. Do we seek the integrity that ensures that our Sunday beliefs are translated into weekday reality? If we follow Paul's advice, and focus on those things that are true, noble and good, and if we to do those things, as he did, then justice and integrity will be the fruits of our lives, and we too will know the God of peace. Because when we do justice, then we have found true religion. *Peter Edwards (The Living Word)*

UPDATE ON COVID 19

<u>Visits to the Sick</u> Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should take particular care when visiting the sick in their parish (see guidance published by Bishop's Conference on 25th August 2020). They should not visit successive households in one session but should space home visits over a period of time, taking care with all aspects of hygiene between visits.

<u>Some Reminders about Distribution of Holy Communion</u> The very last thing you should do before distributing Holy Communion, is to sanitise your hands. Avoid touching your face covering or face whilst distributing Holy Communion and If you come into contact with a communicant by accident, please sanitise your hands.

<u>Track and Trace</u> In keeping with the track and trace system, please add your name to the sign on list in the porch.

NHS COVID-19 APP Those who can, please utilise the NHS COVID-19 APP which is a way of knowing when you are at risk from Coronavirus. The official NHS QR Code Poster, which will guide you through the process, is displayed on the table in the church porch. Thank you.

PLEASE BE AWARE

It is essential to be at church 15 minutes before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

Please enter the church in the normal way and exit through the double doors at the rear of the church.

Please sanitise your hands on entry into the church. Refrain from touching anything in the porch.

There will be no sign of peace. Kneelers in the pews should not be used.

<u>Receiving Communion:</u> Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. <u>Communion</u> can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

Important: At Communion after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

There will be collection baskets for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

FACE MASKS are now compulsory in churches and places of worship and in enclosed spaces at all times.

<u>NEWSLETTER SHEETS</u> If you pick up a copy of the newsletter please take it home with you. In the interest of health and safety, they should not be left on the pews.

<u>AT COMMUNION TIME</u>, to adhere to social distancing rules, please remain in your pew until directed by a steward to proceed to the Altar to receive Holy Communion.

<u>Social gatherings</u> of more than six people, indoors or out, will not be allowed. Please limit your interactions with parishioners after mass and disperse as quickly as possible. Thank you




