The Silent Confession

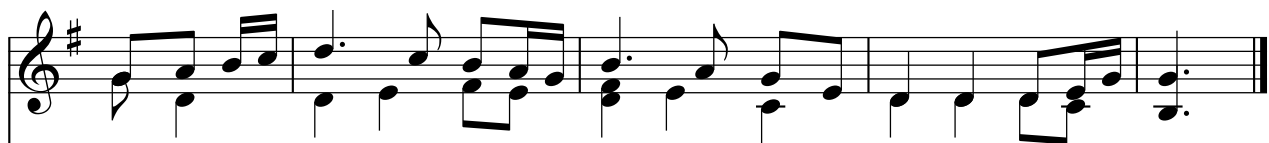
The Assurance of Pardon.....Isaiah 53:5-6
