What are you doing for Lent? Not "giving up", but "doing". there's a lot we can't do: go to Mass, receive Communion. You can give up receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday unless we come up with a brilliant idea.

So what can you do? One thing is to put up with all that's going on (and not going on) in relation to the virus - we can feel helpless.

And it's hard to help: volunteering to help with community events, or schools, or sports is limited these days.

Some people have less money and some people have more money these days: Trocaire, Pieta House, Merchants' Quay, Alone, St Vincent de Paul are only a few of the groups whose work we can make a Lenten effort to support. Trocaire is concentrating on South Sudan this year - it's a fairly new country, damaged by years of war, and a few years ago I met some women who went off to set up a secondary school for girls from nothing. If I remember correctly they even had to devise a syllabus for some subjects. Those women - Loreto Sisters - stayed there in spite of war.

More things we're trying to do:

What about Confirmation and First Communion? And First Penance? We have tentative dates surrounded by uncertainty! The church is probably the safest place in all this, it's the family gatherings that risk spread of the virus.

Baptisms too remain suspended for now.

Anyway, take care and we'll see how we get through all this.
