Author, Designer, and Instructor Kimberly Einmo will be our speaker at the February 20, 2019 meeting. "Jelly Rolls and Precuts" is the topic of her presentation. Kimberly is a popular IQF instructor, a Janome National spokesperson and a regular on Craftsy.



Lone Starburst is the title of the workshop that Kimberly will lead on Thursday, February 21, 2019 at **Bear** 

Creek United Methodist Church, 16000 Rippling Water Dr, Houston, TX 77084 from 9:30 a.m. – 3:30p. m. Choose your own colorway from your stash; then cut 40 2 ½ inch strips (or use a jelly roll), choose a background fabric and bring them both to the workshop. About 3 ½ yards of background fabric is needed to make a 70 x 70 quilt.

Looking forward to March 20, 2019 when we welcome Jill Finley back to WHQG. Jill's applique techniques are very popular among quilters.

WHQG is very excited to have Jill back for a return visit. She has a new fabric line, and we were lucky she had this one opening on her 2019 calendar and thus did not have to wait until 2020 for her to return. Jill



will do both the guild lecture and the following day (March 21, 2019) a workshop at Quilt n Sew in Katy.

She has a new fabric line, "Home Again" and several new quilts in her trunk show. The workshop she will teach on Thursday, March 21, 9.30 - 3.30 at Ouilt n Sew in Katy, TX focuses on her pattern, "Around the Town". The quilt has a medallion square featuring appliqued flowers made using her simple technique. Sign up will be available beginning with the February meeting.



On April 17, 2019 we welcome Diane Kirkhart for her first visit to WHQG. Her amazing trunk show features her

Quilt 'n Sew on her paper piecing techniques, and we learn to make a rosette block. Supply list coming soon! Sign up is available now.

At each guild meeting look for the tri-fold schedule that will outline upcoming speakers and workshop topics. Guild workshop fees are \$35.00 per member.

#### **COMFORT QUILTERS / COMMUNITY SERVICE**

Comfort Quilters met for brunch on January 3 at IHOP and afterwards drove to The Glazier Center to get 2019 started. We completed 18 preemie quilts that day and another 37 on January 17. At the meeting on the 17th, each person picked up 8 fat quarters which they were to cut and have ready to sew into the Wickedly Easy Quilt the following week. Several had their quilt sewn together when we met on the 24th and Cindy Holik had put hers together in a completely new and very attractive way. I think this is a pattern we will be making several times before 2019 is over. COME JOIN US AND LEARN A NEW, EASY PATTERN.

At the January guild meeting, the following were turned in: 12 adult

quilts, 9 Linus quilts, 12 preemies, and 2 that were large enough to put in the disaster stash. Remember that kits are always available to be picked up at each guild meeting--some to be pieced and others that just need to be quilted and bound. Starting after the quilt show, we will open the guild storage for members to pick up backing for quilts one Saturday a month. More info on this later
