#### Why Should the Struggles of Immigrants Matter to Kingcrest?

It is because there are several barriers that immigrants must face. One barrier is the language and another one is the isolation. We know that Kingcrest has been responding to those needs. Besides teaching English, Kingcrest supports the students with English conversational meetings and Bible study every Friday. This year, we are using the Christianity Explored material. Our participants are from many different countries, such as: Bangladesh, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Mexico, Chile, El Salvador and Colombia.

Currently, Michael Witten not only teaches ESL at Kingcrest, but also leads the Bible study. It is in simplified English, which allows the participants to practice their speaking, increase their vocabulary and share their own experiences related to the topic we talk about each session.

Every Friday we enjoy a delicious meal prepared by wonderful volunteers. They contribute to make a comfort-

able and welcoming environment for these newcomers. Among the volunteers we have a teenager who plays with the children while their parents attend the Bible study. We want to enable our students (especially newcomers), to find a community and friendship in Canada.

# Meet Margaret Ho

ESL Teacher

The reality of not being able to understand and be understood is an experience that I wish on nobody.

The first time I was faced with these feelings was when I attended my first lecture in Canada as a foreign student from Hong Kong. It was a lecture on Biology which was always my favourite subject, but instead of being able to understand the content, I found myself unable to grasp even a single meaningful English word. I was totally devastated. I knew that failing academically would dearly sadden my parents who had worked so hard to send their child to study abroad. I studied hard and learned by reading all materials ahead of each class. It was a difficult and lonely journey, and if not for the angels that God had sent me, I probably would have given up.

God is good. He sent an old French lady, a next door neighbour, who invited me for cookies and tea every Sunday afternoon after her church service. With my broken English, we talked and she happily tolerated my inadequate vocabulary and mispronunciation without even once pointing out a mistake. After a few months, she suffered a stroke and had to be moved to stay with her son in Ontario. I know she was God-sent, for without her encouragement, I would not have had the opportunity and confidence to practice my English at all.

I came to know about Jesus Christ through many Christian friends who unselfishly demonstrated their love for others and for me. Through the study of the Holy Scripture I came to realise that I am a sinner and I need the gift of salvation so that my sin can 



be forgiven. And God has been faithful all these years. He has blessed me with many opportunities to serve Him and serve others. I am grateful to be part of the Kingscrest ESL family. We minister to those who long to understand and to be understood in English.
