"God on Trial" | Exodus 16:31-17:7 SERMON NOTES FOR PEOPLE YOUNG & OLD

## I. Introduction

- A. How does Moses illustrate what lack of faith is for us? How does this help us to understand spiritual matters?
- **B.** What does Israel's refusal to trust God to provide for their physical needs indicate about their spiritual state?
- C. Why is Israel bringing a lawsuit against their God?

## II. Main Argument

- A. Memorial of Faithfulness (vv. 31-36)
  - 1. Forgetfulness anticipated (vv. 31-34):
    - a. What does God show Israel with the manna He provides? Why should they remember that?
    - b. Application: in what sense in the Manna a foretaste of the Promised Land? What reminders has God given the New Covenant Church of His faithfulness?
  - 2. Faithful Provision (vv. 35-36): why is it significant Israel never lacked bread in the morning in all the forty years?
  - 3. <u>Application</u>: How is our spiritual food the same as Israel's?

#### **B.** Israel's Indictment (vv. 1-3, 7b)

1. Desert Travels(v. 1): why is the lack of water at Rephadim a particular disappointment? Who led Israel there?

- **2.** <u>Outrageous Response (vv. 2-3)</u>: what is the problem with Israel's complaint?</u>
  - a. Why is their grumbling here especially problematic (sinful)?
  - **b.** <u>Application</u>: in what ways particularly did Israel grumble, and how does the Apostle Paul warn against such grumbling?

#### C. Moses' Complaint (v. 4)

- 1. <u>Moses' Prayer</u>: How does the phrasing of Moses' prayer (compliant) Israel's grumbling has infected him a bit too?
- 2. Moses' Legitimate Concerns: what is Moses worried about?

#### D. God's Acquittal (vv. 5-7)

- 1. Elders Summoned (v. 5): how do the elders function here?
- 2. <u>God Judged (v. 6)</u>: How does God provide life for Israel?
- 3. <u>Application</u>: How do God's actions here foreshadow the life and ministry of the Lord Jesus Christ?
- 4. <u>Application</u>: What is the antidote to grumbling?
  - **a.** Why does the richness of God's provision for sinners offer assurance of God's steadfast commitment to His people?
  - **b.** How does Christ's own submission provide life for us?
