A READING FROM THE HOLY GOSPEL ACCORDING TO LUKE 1:1-4; 4:14-21

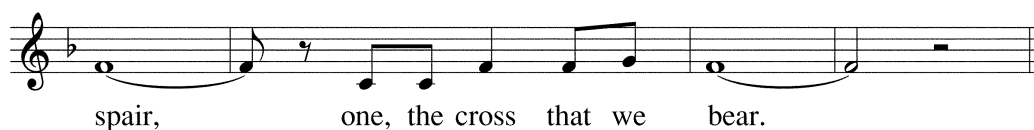

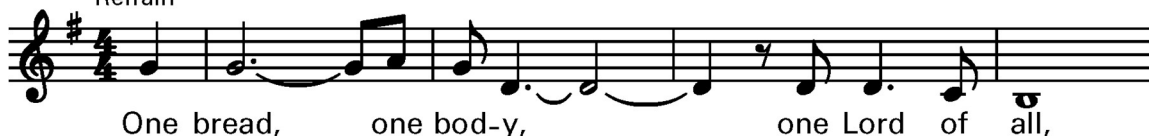
