Sunshine Jazz Organization Bids Farewell To Our Beloved "Lady Day"

The world has lost a true artist and renaissance woman. After battling heart disease, Alice Day passed away on July 10, at age 74. Our beloved *Alice Vergerie Day* began singing jazz on the Liberty City street corners as a child. Born the second of seven children on March 9, 1946 in Alachua County, FL, Alice was raised in Miami and has been called "South Florida's First Lady of Jazz" so often that she has earned the title. {Billie "Lady Day" Holiday was her first "teacher}

The first song Alice Day learned as a jazz singer was Holiday's rendition of "God Bless the Child." She never had formal singing lessons but learned by listening to Holiday's records, learning every inflection and sound. A graduate of Miami Northwestern Senior High School in 1963, Alice never forgot those "lessons." She was regarded among the premier song stylists in South Florida, named Best Female Jazz Vocalist at the South Fla Music Awards in 1984. Not long after, she opened her own jazz space, "Alice's Place", tucked inside Fort Lauderdale's Musicians Exchange in 1989.

"I should have been born 20 years earlier," Day told the Miami Herald in 1984. "A quick scan of her influences bears this out," they wrote. "There is a touch of the tormented phrasing of Billie Holiday, the tight-lipped delivery of Nancy Wilson, and the spirit of Ernestine Anderson in Day's work." Said Alice at the time, "It's what I'm supposed to be doing. I can't imagine what will happen if people are allowed to forget about this music. I have a duty to keep it alive." At 15 she faked her age to get her first professional job at the Rockland Palace in Overtown. A high school student, who aced business classes, she made \$5 a night working in the kitchen and singing with the band. Aunt Shirley Crawford loaned her clothes, fixed her makeup and drove her to the club. She told Day's mother she was baby-sitting. "She was too young to be in the club, but she had the voice of a woman," Crawford told the Herald in 1989.

In 1955, Day's family relocated to Miami and joined Metropolitan AME Church in Liberty City. Alice began singing there and for a time was the church's choir director, remaining a lifelong member. She spent 8 years in Chicago and New York in the 70's, tapping into the more competitive jazz communities, then returned home to improve son Rory's schooling. She played multiple sets at clubs and lounges from Miami-Dade to Palm Beach counties, often into the wee hours. Those settings suited her subtle rasp in her voice.

"I consider myself a saloon singer. I like smoky joints," she told the Sun Sentinel in 1988. "She's done an awful lot to keep the music going when work gets slim," jazz radio icon China Valles said in the 1980s. "When there was nothing happening, Alice was out there hustling. She helps a lot of people." She helped form Sunshine Jazz Organization along with Valles. She hosted a jazz program on WLRN radio. Alice had international residencies in Thailand & Switzerland and, in 2009, founded The South Florida Jazz Hall of Fame, celebrating the 11th year and 67 worthy Inductees in July 2020.

Lady Day never gave up helping recognize local talent in a genre that still struggles to gain traction. "She was one of the first people in South Florida to embrace me when I was just starting," said Nicole Yarling, one of South Florida's current premier jazz talents. "Alice Day, Mel Dancy, Pete Minger, Ira Sullivan, and China Valles saw something in me that I had not yet realized. They were my mentors."

For Alice, the goal was to embody the music, to be believable. "If you don't feel it, something's wrong with either me or you," she told the Sentinel in 1988. "One of us has got a hole in our soul somewhere. Music is so much a part of me, it's like breathing in and breathing out."

Day's survivors include her son Rory Kelley, brothers Johnny, Arthur and Jesse, sisters Annist Brown, Barbara Pryor and Joyce Reid, five grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren. An "Alice Day/China Valles Jazz Foundation" is in the works and we'll keep you posted when finalized.


