Please consider purchasing scrip for your upcoming projects and help out St. Mary's I.C. For anyone who has never bought Scrip or not familiar with it. Scrip is a gift card you buy and use like a pre-paid credit card at local businesses throughout the Stevens Point area. Our parish receives on an average 4% from these businesses for using their cards. If you are looking for larger denominations for Menards, Fleet Farm etc... we can order that for you. Thank you for supporting our scrip program!

<u>Project Milk</u> second collection on Sunday, May 22, envelopes are in the pews. How much do we need?

• Casa Hogar uses about 1 sack (50 pounds) of powdered milk each week. Sample bag is hanging in the church entrance

It costs about \$100.00 to send 1 sack of milk to Lurín, Peru.

• Your donation goes straight to the purchase, preparation and shipment of the milk. Administrative costs are covered by the Diocesan Annual Appeal. It is only your continued support that makes these shipments possible.

How much does it cost? The cost of everything has gone up.

• \$400 will provide Casa Hogar with 4 sacks milk, enough for one month. A missionary there says they make it into yogurt, which makes it really popular.

• As of March 2022 the approximate price of 100 pounds of raw milk for Wisconsin farmers was \$20.87. \$3.53 higher than last year. Maybe even higher today.

We wish to thank all of you that will give so generously to Project Milk! Your contributions are not only an act of charity for the orphans of Casa Hogar in Peru, but also a strong show of solidarity and support for our dairy farmers.



After the leak of the Dobbs Supreme Court draft opinion, Archbishop William Lori, Chairman of the US Bishops' Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement: "The leak related to the U.S. Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization reminds us of the urgent need for prayer and action at this pivotal moment in our country. As Catholics, we care about every unborn child and every mother. As the bishops shared in our statement Standing with Moms in Need: we pledge 'to redouble our efforts to accompany women and couples who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, and during the early years of parenthood, offering them loving and compassionate care through initiatives such as Walking with Moms in Need and countless others.' "At the same time, as we await the Court's decision, we urge everyone to intensify their prayer and fasting that the final decision of the Court will bring about the reversal of Roe and Casey. We hope and pray for a change in our laws and stand ready to help all pregnant women in need in each of our communities. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us and guide us."
