|  | Germany. First called the "running machine," it is a wooden, hobby horse style bike propelled by one's own feet. |
| 1860s | French inventors add pedals, attaching them to the front wheel. This is the first use of the term "bicycle," but many people call the wooden bikes "boneshakers." |
| 1869 | Solid rubber tires are first used. |
| 1870s | Penny-farthings (high-wheeled bicycles) become popular and allow for faster, smoother cycling. |
| 1870s | The unicycle is invented. |
| $1885$ | The safety bicycle (resembling today's bike) revolutionizes biking with equal-sized wheels and a chain drive. |
| $1933$ | The cruiser bike, with its wide tires and comfortable saddle, is first sold. |
| $\begin{gathered} 1960 s \\ \text { \| } \end{gathered}$ | Racing bikes are introduced, as are banana seat bikes. |
| 1970s | Mountain bikes first originated. |
