MONUMENT TO LATE DR. WM. HOWARD DAY DEDICATED

Bishop J. W. Smith Will Deliver the Episcopal Address Today—
Reports Submitted

The A. M. E. Zion conference is growing in interest and has increased in attendance that last evening two meetings were held simultaneously, one at Wesley Union and the other at Harris. Rev. Farley Fisher, of Williamsport, was the speaker at Wesley and Rev. E. S. Bailey, of Syracuse, N. Y., delivered the sermon at Harris. A lecture on The Educational Needs of the Negro Today, interested the Wesley Union audience which taxed the utmost capacity of the auditorium.

The afternoon was spent as was the morning in listening to the presiding elders' reports and addresses. Rev. Dr. J. C. Temple speaking for the Harrisburg district, showed that every church except one or two had reported in full along all lines. His address indicated that there would be some changes in the pastors of the district. Rev. Dr. M. L. Blalock explained the few failures in the prosperous Washington district. There was painful silence when the ill and very feeble Dr. E. H. Curry, who had risen from a bed of illness to make his report read the admirable record of the Washington district.

A special committee was appointed to represent the conference at the dedication of the monument erected to memory of Dr. William Howard Day at Lincoln ceremony. A heroic size bust of the well-known late public educator crowned the beautiful monument. The dedication program follows:

Master of ceremonies, Dr. E. D. W. Jones; singing, choir; prayer, Rev. Dr. C. H. Curry; presentation of monument, H. S. Sigler; acceptance, Dr. Corroughers; Professor Day, as a Churchman, Hon. John C. Dancy; singing, choir; Dr. Day, as an Educator, Supt. F. E. Downes and J. Howard Wert; Dr. Day, as a Citizen, Dr. Bowles.

Today the Episcopal address, the most important paper of the session, will be delivered by Bishop J. W. Smith. Rev. J. Ed. Mason, an eloquent representative of Livingstone College. Rev. J. R. Dangerfield. Rev. J. T. Matthews, late arrivals, will also speak.
