Preschool: Welcome to March, where it can be 70 one day and 30 the next! Please dress in layers, we will try to go out as much as we can. This week we will begin our fun March activities. We will be working on shamrock matching, rainbow letters and we will learn what colors to mix together to make new colors. The fourth and final quarter starts today. Kind: This week we are talking about farms! Our vocabulary words are plan, fetched, dragged, filthy, and pondered. In phonics, we will review all sounds including /sh/ and /ch/, and introduce both sounds that /th/ makes. In math, we will learn about nickels, counting by 5's, counting nickels to 25 cents, and we will review cylinders. Have a great week!

1st/2nd: This week in 1st grade we will be learning about planets. We will read several informational books that talk about planets. We learned about planets in science several weeks ago, but they will be reading and writing about them this week. We will discuss why an author writes something, the difference between a star and a planet, and the main detail in a text. In grammar we will learn the au/aw says /o/ as well as proofreading sentences and making corrections. We will also talk about question words such as who, what, when, where and why. In math we will be learning different fractional parts of a shape (1/2, 1/3, 1/6), comparing numbers using symbols (<, >, =) and estimating capacity of objects using cups. In 2nd grade we will be reading the story Rosie Revere, Engineer, by Andrea Beaty. We will talk about why authors rhyme sometimes and character traits. In grammar we will be learning about irregular verbs, contractions and that tion says /shun/. We will review apostrophes with possessive nouns as well. In math this week we will be working on telling time down to the minute, counting all our coins together, making sums over a dollar, and parallel lines. We will also start adding 3-digit numbers towards the end of the week. At home activities to help with math could be having your child add change, find parallel lines at home (on the highway), and ask them what time it is every so often, if you have an analog clock. - Mrs. Thomas

Both grades will have a test in Social Studies over their Missouri Studies Weekly week 19. Students have completed those study guides as well, so be on the lookout for them for review. – Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 5th grade will start "Cinquain" poetry and 6th grade will be making "Shape" poems. In Science, 5th grade will start a new unit over the solar system and 6th grade will read about light and color. In Reading, students have started a new Lit. Circle book called "A Year Down Yonder" and will present roles on Friday. In Social Studies, 5th grade will test next Tuesday over Ch. 4 and 6th grade will be reading about pyramids and King Tut. Both grades will have a label Europe test this Friday. Students will also start a new geography unit this week. **7th / 8th Comm. Arts:** Both grades will present their "Bio" Projects to the class this Wed. Students have also started reading our Lit. Circle book, "The Maze Runner" and will present their first roles this Friday. 5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students are working on reciprocals, data displays, and 2-digit divisors.
