

November is the time of year we think about Thanksgiving and the end of the harvest season. For some, this marks the un-official start of the Christmas shopping season. Others are reminded that cold weather and snow (ever notice that snow is a four-letter word?) will be falling soon and we will have to shovel.

We learned about the first American Thanksgiving shared by the Pilgrims and the Indians when we were in grade school. For many contemporary Americans the fourth Thursday in November is a day for eating to much, watching football, and planning the attack on Black Friday. Often we neglect the very purpose of the holiday, Giving Thanks.

We may find it convenient to offer a token thanks to God. What does it mean to give thanks to God? The



Do we express our thanks to God in the manner expressed in these meanings? The idea of being open in our appreciation to God frightens some. Imagine doing good things for someone who never expresses a word of appreciation to you for what you have done. For most of us, we

would be bothered by that kind of treatment. Yet, we treat God that way. When we receive a nice gift from a friend, we are open and joyful in expressing our appreciation for that person. From God, we take even greater gifts for granted, barely mentioning what He has done for us. God has blessed us far greater than any human can with the gifts of life, health, energy, many blessings and most of all eternal life. Still we barely say a word of thanks to God or share our appreciation with others.

Even if we express our gratitude in these ways, we often fail to be thankful for what God will do. Thanking God for what He will do is not only an expression of thanks, but it also gives expresses our faith in God's ability to complete what He has begun. Hebrews 11:1 states "faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see" (ESV). Numerous times in the book of Psalms, we read, "Give thanks to the Lord, for His steadfast love endures forever". The love of God for us has not yet ended, express thanks to God for His love for us.

This year, make it practice to express thanks to God, not only on Thanksgiving, but daily. Look for what He has done for you. When you look, you might be surprised at what you might find. Express faith by not only thanking God for what He has done for you, but also in what He will do.




Thanksgiving Service

Pat Answers What Happens at a Great Lakes District Conference?

I recently attended the Great Lakes District Annual Conference October 14 and 15 at the seminary I graduated from, our Evangelical Free Seminary called Trinity Evangelical Divinity School located in Deerfield, IL (about 25 miles north of Chicago). Our church is part of the Great Lakes District of the Evangelical Free Church. This district includes northern Illinois, Chicagoland, Norther Indiana, northwest Ohio, and Michigan. It has about 200 churches and we had just over 250 attenders. Our regional District Superintendent for Michigan is Harvey Pflug who preached at our church on July 21.

Every year in October the District hosts their own annual meeting, usually in the Chicago area. At these conferences there is a theme and guest speakers and workshops, designed to encourage pastors and church leaders. There is a special focus on Pastor's Wives and also Youth Pastors. This year's theme was Resilient Ministry – referring to recovering quickly from difficult or stretching situations.

Our first speaker was a Christian Artist now from California, Makoto Fujimura, who recently completed illustrating the Gospels for Crossway Publishers. He spoke on Emotional and Cultural Intelligence from an artist's perspective. He challenged churches to be patient with artsy people (I thought of my own daughter Tricia!), and then preached on the Greek word "Poiema", which is translated "workmanship" in Ephesians 2:10 – *"for we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works….*" His point was that God is creative and makes us creative for His glory. We are to use our gifts and live our lives as poetry back to God for the wonderful grace of the gospel in Jesus Christ.

I attended a workshop on the Leadership Pipeline which was challenging us to train and equip leaders at all levels for ministry. The goal is to make disciples who make disciples. This is something I need to refocus on and keep at the heart of ministry.

At the evening dinner in the College Guest Dining

Hall our Evangelical Free President Kevin Kompelien from Minneapolis, MN spoke from Acts 1, 2 on Being Bold For Jesus. It was a good challenge and reminder to not be ashamed of the gospel!

Another Main Session was on Marriage and Family and our speakers were Eric and Erikah Rivera from a replanted E.Free Church in Chicago. They spoke from Genesis 2:24 on the Biblical Foundation for Marriage – *"For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh."* They spoke on the necessity of LEAVING, CLEAVING AND WEAVING. They particularly challenged pastors to not neglect their own marriages, and be examples of Christ ourselves. It was a good reminder and I used some of their material in my sermon on October 20.

Our last speaker was the new President of Trinity International University, our college and our seminary. He spoke on Spiritual Formation from the Gospel of Luke. His main point was THE NECESSITY OF BEAR-ING GOOD FRUIT FOR JESUS. It was encouraging and challenging. At the business luncheon we heard stories of God at work, and also voted on the 2020 Budget for the District.

One of the best parts for me at these conferences is reconnecting with pastors that I only see once a year at these conferences. I was able to eat most of my meals with pastors from Michigan, including St. Joseph, Midland, and Bay City. I enjoyed the fellowship and laughter too. I also spent time with an E. Free Foundation leader named Lanny Harris that I see almost every year. He loves Jesus and always encourages me. So thank you for sending me to this year's conference. It was good for my soul and life. May we each continue to grow in grace, In Christ,
