#### My Conversion

My wife and I have been attending the FCC for approximately 12 yrs. In that time I have met some really good people. I have worked on many breakfasts, dinners, and other fundraisers. I have served on several committees. Almost without exception the experiences have been more rewarding for me than anything I gave. I have been proud to tell outsiders about who and what we (the FCC) are and what we do. One thing I did not do was discuss with anyone what they or Karen and I pledged to the Church. I believed that is between us (or you) and God. I do however believe that it is a must do (both work and give).

For the last two years I have had the privilege of being on the Finance committee and the Board of Directors and am currently the Treasurer. In those positions I have become familiar with the costs of running our beautiful church and the need for money to pay these costs. We have really good people working for us. They have to be paid every two weeks. We must heat the church so folks want to be there Sunday morning. 10% of our budget goes directly to the Missions Committee to fulfill their giving. We must pay for lawn care and winter plowing. The electric company must be paid to keep the lights on. Those costs do not come down no matter how hard we try and we try very hard.

As I travel around the area, I see building after building that is shuttered or repurposed. Those buildings were once vibrant churches like ours. The combination of knowing our needs and the consequences of not meeting those costs have convinced me I can no longer be silent. I still do not want to know who gives what. That is still between you and God but I do have to speak out

about the need and what I feel is an obligation to support what we have. That is my conversion.

A couple of weeks ago I had the opportunity to show our sanctuary to a couple of strangers. As they walked in their amazement with the beauty of that sanctuary made me look again. Sometimes we can look at the roses we see every day and not really appreciate their beauty. Seeing them through someone else's eyes can give one a whole new perspective and appreciation for what we get to see every day. That was my experience conducting that tour. We are truly blessed but sometimes, I think, we take our blessings for granted and just expect it will always be there. My travels tell me that without support it won't be, no matter how hard we work.

#### Framework for Reviewing our Church

William Temple was the 98th Archbishop of Canterbury (1942–1944). One of his famous sayings: "The Church is the only society that exists for the benefit of those who are not its members." (Diocese of Monmouth, Bishop's visitation Charge, 2007. Retrieved April 17, 2008.) While the church is to care for one another, encourage one another in life and on our spiritual journeys, and to hold each one accountable, we are also commissioned to make disciples of Jesus Christ. (Matthew 28:19). As we move into the New Year with our commission in mind, I (Pastor Pat) would like to give us a framework to think about why we are a church and what we are doing as a body. Three questions to reflect on before the church forms opinions or make decisions might be:

- \*Is what we want a personal preference or Godly purpose? This question takes us from "I want..." to asking what does God want in this situation? An example of this might be deciding on the music we sing. Does the music we sing make a difference to God? Does God care if we have traditional hymns or a rock and roll band?
- \* Are we outward looking or inward looking? This question helps us to think about the folks outside that are not yet in a relationship with Christ. Are we speaking their language? Singing their music? If they came into worship, would they be comfortable?
- \* Are we a church committed to raising up the next generation? This is a question not only about valuing children, youth, and young adults, but also investing ourselves to be participants, mentors, and educators in the spiritual development of others.

I hope as we move forward this year, that more and more folks might be involved in activities beyond simple coming to worship: committees, Spirit-chat, Bible study, choir, women's group, retreats, men's breakfast, game night, knit, stitch, and pray, craft fairs, suppers, etc. As we have conversations within each of these groups, we might keep these three questions in mind to guide our conversations and visions.
