Rules & Regulations

- 1. **Approved helmets must be worn by all Competitors**. This is the Rule of Victorian Agricultural Shows Ltd. It is compulsory for everyone competing on a horse working, schooling or riding for any other reason at a Show or in any area considered to be part of the Showgrounds.
- 2. In ring one and two a competitor who wins an Open or Showhunter Championship is ineligible to enter the equivalent classes in the other rings.
- 3. Enter in either Hunter Classes or Open, not both.
- 4. All stallions must wear a bit in their mouth and are only to be exhibited (ridden & led) by exhibitors 18 years and over.
- 5. The judge's decision shall be final. In any class, it will be left to the judge's discretion to award a first Prize or to split or amalgamate classes.
- 6. The committee reserves the right to alter or cancel any event.
- 7. Definition of terms: a. First season exhibit not to be shown prior to 1st January 2022
- 8. Dogs must be restrained on a leash.
- 9. Ground stewards have the power to evict horses not properly restrained whilst on showgrounds.
- 10. Random drug testing may be carried out under VAS and EA Rules.
- 11. All competitors exhibit entirely at their own risk.

Measuring

- 12. The height certificates issued by the RASA and the EFA are duly recognized by the Show Society.
- 13. All horses and ponies must be exhibited in accordance with the certificate issued by these respective organisations.

Rules & Regulations

An exhibitor having won the overall Champion Fleece at Show, will be eligible for the group final; the winner will then be required to submit a Fleece at the State Final

An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one group in the State Final.

Each Fleece entered must be a bona fide product of the exhibitor.

If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, then the second place getter is eligible to compete.

All fleeces to be returned to the owner at the completion of the competition.

Wool classes

All wool of current season's of not more than 12 months length to be presented to judge skirted. All entry forms need to be clearly labelled. All fleeces must have a tag attached to each fleece stating the exhibitors name and class number. Rams fleece ineligible for champion fleece of show. Wet wool will not be judged.

SPECIAL CLASS: classes marked with (*) winner can go onto group final in 2023.

220g tin crushed pineapple, drained

½ teaspoon allspice

80g pecans, coarsely crushed

2 teaspoons salt

METHOD:

Preheat oven 180°C (160°C fan forced). Grease a 23cm round cake tin and line with baking paper. Sift dry ingredients together in a bowl. In a separate bowl, beat eggs & oil, then add dry ingredients. Mix well then add carrots, pineapple & pecans. Mix to a smooth batter & pour into cake tin. Bake for approx 90 - 100 minutes or until skewer comes out clean. Remove from oven and allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin on a wire rack. Upend and allow to cool on tea towel on a cake cooler.

250g sultanas,

250g chopped raisins,

250g currants,

125g mixed peel,

90g chopped red glace cherries,

Mix together all the fruit and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy.

Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably over-

Sift together the flour and spices, cream together butter, sugar with essences. Add eggs one at a time, beat well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixture. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.

Place mixture into a prepared 20cm (8") **square tin,** 4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a **straight sided, square cornered tin (no rounded cor**greased and lined 20cm (8") round cake tin. ners) and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

All fruit to be chopped uniform sizes, to ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.


