Operational Structure:

The Trust employs a manager, two office administrators, a nurse practitioner, two district nurses and two practice nurses, who also contribute to the after-hours on call prime roster, and cleaners. Along with the nurse practitioner, GP locums are contracted to provide 1.2 FTE to service the Teviot Community.

Main Sources of Entity's Cash and Resources:

Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board has received its income from a community health services contract with the Southern District Health Board, a capitation payment from Wellsouth PHO, various service contracts with Wellsouth PHO, Accident Compensation Corporation payments, patient fees, and designated funding lines specifically to rural areas.

The Community Health Services Main Agreement with the Southern District Health Board was negotiated, extending the service term [1 September 2021 to 31 August 2023 (2 years)] and varying the contract price.

Main Methods Used by the Entity to Raise Funds:

Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board does not currently undertake in any fundraising activities. It has received very good financial support in the past from the Otago Community Trust and Central Lakes Trust in the form of grants and donations towards capital projects.

Statement of Accounting Policies For the Year ended 31 March 2022

Reporting Entity

Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board (the 'Trust') was registered on the 16th February 1972 under the Charitable Trusts Act 1957, and subsequently registered on the 8th January 2008 as a Charity under the Charities Act 2005. Registered as Charity number CC20404.

Basis of Preparation

As a registered charity, Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board is required to comply with the financial reporting framework for financial statements. The Trust has elected to apply PBE SFR-A (NFP) Public Benefit Entity Simple Format Reporting – Accrual (Not-for-Profit) on the basis that it does not have public accountability and has total annual expenses of equal to or less than \$2,000,000. All transactions in the performance report are reported using the accrual basis and historical cost basis of accounting. The performance report is prepared under the assumption that the Trust will continue to operate in the foreseeable future.

The financials and other statements are presented in New Zealand dollars.

Particular Accounting Policies

The following particular accounting policies adopted in the financial statements have a significant effect on the results and financial position.

Revenue

All income items are recorded in the Statement of Financial Performance in the year it is earned. All revenue and expenses from all sources are recorded in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Sale of Goods & Services

Revenue comprises the amounts received and receivable for goods and services supplied to customers in the ordinary course of business. Sales are recognised in the period in which the sale or service is rendered, by reference to completion of the specific transaction assessed on the basis of the actual service provided as a proportion of the total services to be provided.

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

Rental Income

Rental income is recognised on an accruals basis in accordance with the substance of the relevant agreement.

Grants

Grants are recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance when the requirements under the grant agreement have been met. Any grants for which the requirements under the grant agreement have not been completed are carried as liabilities until all the conditions have been fulfilled.

Inventory Valuation

Stock on hand is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

■ Goods & Services Tax (GST)

The Trust is registered for GST. The Statement of Financial Performance has been prepared so that all components are stated exclusive of GST. All items in the Statement of Financial Position are stated net of GST, with the exception of receivables and payables, which include GST invoiced.

Taxation

The Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board has registered as a charity under the Charities Act 2005, from 8 January 2008 and therefore is exempt from income tax.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Cash balances in the Statement of Cash Flows comprise cash on hand and current and savings bank accounts, with original maturities of 90 days or less.

M Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivables are recognised initially at fair value less provision for doubtful debts. Bad debts are written off in the year in which they are identified. Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts which are known to be uncollectible are written off. A provision for doubtful receivables is established when there is objective evidence that the Trust will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of receivables with the amount of the provision is recognised in the Statement of Financial Performance.

Trades & Other Payables

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers.

Employee Entitilements

Provision is made in respect of Roxburgh District Medical Services Trust Board liability for annual leave. Annual leave has been calculated on an actual entitlement basis at current rates of pay.

Property, Plant & Equipment

The Roxburgh Hospital land purchased in 1998 from Health Care Otago Ltd has been recorded at cost. Other assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no significant changes in accounting policies from those applied last year.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been charged on fixed assets based on the depreciation method considered appropriate given their estimated useful life. They have not been adjusted for residual value. The rate and method are as follows:

Our Opinion
