Alcohol inks workshop



Bonnie Bodensteiner will instruct an Alcohol Ink workshop on Saturday, February 11 from 10 a.m until 4 p.m. at the Danville Art League.

We will have a pot luck lunch. Meat will be provided. Please bring something to share.

The workshop includes the use of alcohol inks on many different non-porous surfaces. Participants will need to bring a mask (rubbing alcohol used), tight fitting rubber gloves and an apron. The class is limited to 12 participants.

Class fee is \$50 for members and \$55 for non-members.

Felt workshop



Teresa Campbell will be the instructor for a felt workshop on Saturday, January 28 from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Teresa has been a needle felting artist since her first project in 2007. It's one of many art mediums she enjoys.

Needle felting is the art of binding wool fibers to create new shapes and textures. In her class you'll learn the origin of "felt," differences in fibers, needles to use and other types of felting. You'll make a heart shaped felted Valentine that you can decorate to your liking.

Kits with all supplies are provided. Class size is limited to 15 students.

Cost is \$30, plus a \$10 kit fee - which is yours to keep.
