


Chronic Wasting Disease Surveillance

Help monitor the health of our wildlife populations



Chronic wasting disease (CWD) is a fatal disease that affects the central nervous system of deer, elk and moose. There is no cure or prevention for the disease.

The disease is caused by infectious proteins, called prions. These infectious proteins accumulate in the nervous tissue of the animal causing microscopic holes in the brain. Animals appear healthy in the early stages of the disease. CWD is invariably fatal and expected to have negative impacts on deer and elk populations throughout North America.

The disease transmits from one animal to another through contaminated saliva, feces, urine, soil and water.

Priority surveillance zones for 2017

Any cervid (i.e. deer, elk or moose) harvested in Saskatchewan can be tested free of charge for CWD. However, in an attempt to increase sample size in certain areas of the province, priority surveillance zones have been set for 2017. These include; **WMZ 12, 13, 14E and 14W** in the south-west. **WMZ 16, 31 and 33** in the southeast. **WMZ 50, 63 and 64** in the north-central. In order to make submission easier, remote drop-off freezers have been set up at Saskatchewan Landing and Moose Mountain provincial parks. All hunters that harvest cervids in these zones are asked to submit samples for testing.
