



My first trip to the Capital Cichlid Association (CCA)

This was my first time going to the CCA and I was looking forward to getting together with my CCY friends Michael Mull, and Liz & Dwayne Walker. I met Michael Mull early at That Fish Place with coffee and then on the road to the Walkers. I was very excited to go to my first meeting especially when I found out what was on the auction list. Once at the Walkers we all got in one vehicle and drove to the CCA and we all talked about the meeting and were excited to here the speaker Dan Sharifi who spoke about the care and husbandry of the new world cichlids. I of course couldn't stop talking about how much I wanted the special item on the auction list which was F1 Tropheus Moorii Nkonde. I am sure the Walkers and Michael wanted to put me in the trunk by the time we took our first rest stop break. It was great to see some of our fellow fish friends Matt Quinn, Christine Keys, Greg O'Neil, Joshua Wiegert, Frank Cowherd and many others I

apologize if I missed your name.



So why Tropheus you ask? Well I think the fish is just beautiful and I learned the hard way what not to do. I have gained a lot of knowledge from Greg O'Neil and Pam Chin. My first 75 gallon tank I purchased 8-10 various Tropheus and then I went to PetSmart and purchased some more and my last purchase with that tank was an auction. This tank was my beautiful variety of Tropheus but also turned out to be the worst as I learned Tropheus do much better with their own species and this tank had numerous kinds and sizes and they ended up either killing each other or died. The one bag of 11 Tropheus that I bought at an auction all died and I found out they all had a worm type virus that they were infected with and I don't think I could of done anything to save them. So this was an expensive learning experience for me but I grew from that. My love for Tropheus continues

to grow and I now have a book and do research on the computer when I have time to try and make their life here as comfortable as possible.

So back to the CCA Auction I know you are wondering did I win those F1 Nkonde well of course I did. Actually it was a little bit of a battle and I was about to stop as I knew the guy who I was bidding against already told me he wanted the bid to be high as these fish were a donation to the club and he wanted them to bring high numbers for the club. I was getting worried when we went from \$85.00 and then \$100.00 and finally at \$110.00 I didn't think I was going to go any further and finally he stopped and I won. I jumped up and down like a little kid I was so happy that is the only item I wanted. On the auction list they were listed as qty 15 but they ended up being qty 17 so it was an extra bonus.

Currently I have 3 tanks dedicated to just Tropheus I have a 75 gallon with Wild Caught Red Rainbow "Kasanga", 55 gallon with a divider one side is the Nkonde and the other side has Moorii Purple Lufubu both the Lufubu and the Nkonde are 2" or smaller so for now the 55 gallon tank is sufficient. I am looking for a 75 gallon tank to move the Lufubu over to. My last tank is the 75 gallon and that has the remaining survivors of the variety that I first got. I do have 3 Tropheus Dubois for sale and they came from the variety tank and they were picking on the others and 1 Tropheus Dubois that is my show fish that is not for sale. I recommend Tropheus to anyone. There are so many different kinds and all so beautiful. When they look at you they almost look like a puppy dog with their eyes. They each have a personality and I enjoy reading a book or just sitting in my chair watching them. Thanks CCA for a great time and wonderful auction!!

CICHLID NEWS BACK ISSUES

African Haplochromine Cichlids aka Mbuna




What can I say, they are my most favorite kind of cichlid, not only because there are an addicting amount of different colors and species to collect but, because of there up front and social behavior. Every morning I come down to my living room and there they are, all at the top splashing around, letting me know they are there and hungry. I've gotten to the point where I can hold a single piece of food and they will eat it out of my fingers. At first when I started my Mbuna tank there were some casualties but, after learning a few tricks my tank has thrived to hold over 40 species of Mbuna and South African Cichlids.

To start off with you have to understand where these beautiful fish come from. Simply watching a Youtube video of Lake Malawi will open your eyes to how they live. The name mbuna means "rockfish" in the language of the Tonga people of Malawi. Giving your Mbuna plenty of rocks and other places they can swim in and out of is the beginning of a happy haplochromine. The water in Lake Malawi usually ranges from 77-84°F with a pH 7.5-8.4. After you have the tank prepped and ready to go you can start to add your Mbuna. The second trick I learned in the hobby with this kind of fish is, stock the tank with many fish. Mbuna quickly become territorial if too few fish are in the tank and will start to fight. When adding more fish throughout time I've learned smaller juvenile fish are left alone by the pre existing fish in the tank compared to when you add in a large or mature Mbuna. If adding large Mbuna definitely do more than one or even two. Don't be surprised if you wake up the next day to one of the two dead either.



Other than that, Mbuna are an easy pet fish to own. They are very hearty fish and can tolerate if the water is not perfect. They do eat a lot though. Feed your Mbuna twice a day. All that eating makes a lot of poop too. A 25% water change weekly helps keep your tank nice looking, and your fish will glow with color after a water change. Often after a major water change Mbuna will mate. Haplochromine are mouth breeders. Although I'm not sure how it all happens or goes down, the female will hold the eggs and fry until she spits them out or until you help her spit them. That's an amazing experience. The babies jump right out and you'd be amazed by how many they can hold in their mouths. Sadly if a female feels threatened she will swallow the fry. It's not uncommon, especially for first time or young fish.



Labidochromis sp. Hongi is my favorite species of Mbuna, but like I mentioned there are so many different species of this fish. Sometimes I think Dr. Seuss's book *1 Fish 2 Fish Red Fish Blue Fish* was a reference to African Cichlids. The cool thing about Mbuna is that unlike other breeds of fish where only the male is colorful and the female is dull and boring, both male and female are colorful. Mbuna are known to cross breed as well. Don't let that steer you away from that fish if you come across one in a store or auction. The most beautiful fish I own is a hybrid. Although there isn't usually a category for hybrids in fish shows, there should be.

Well there you have it. Hopefully, if you have been thinking about starting an Mbuna tank, this will save you the heartache I experienced, when I first started out as a fish hobbyist starting my Mbuna tank. Mbuna all together are a rewarding breed of cichlid to own for so many reasons. They may not be a Peacock, but they have a completely different nature to them. If you are looking for a sociable and colorful freshwater fish, Mbuna may be what you are looking for.








FINALLY THE RESULTS!!!!

BEHIND THE SCENES.....





The fish club scene has been around for many years dating back to the first aguarium society ever the Gotha Aguarium in Germany, founded in 1882. The two oldest aquarium clubs still in existence are the Brooklyn Aguarium Society in New York City, founded in 1911 and the Boston Aguarium Society, founded in 1916. Today there are clubs all over the world for all kinds of fish hobbyist's. In our area alone we are surrounded by several, Aquarium Club of Lancaster County, Capital Cichlid Association, Bucks County Aquarium Society, Cichlids Of Pennsylvania, North Jersey Aquarium Society, Potomac Valley Aquarium Society just to name a few. Three years ago Scott Mclaughlin had a vision to start a club dedicated specifically to cichlids in our area. In a small club house in Dover, a craigslist add, and about 20 people the Cichlid Club of York was born. Slowly the word got out and each meeting grew. Each meeting held a speaker, auction, food and always felt like friends hanging out and sharing our love of cichlids.

We all attend meetings but have you ever thought about what goes on behind the scenes? How do you get speakers for each month? How to get sponsors and goods to raffle, auction or gift? The upkeep of Facebook and websites? For the first year Scott did much of it. From lining up speakers, to contacting companies for donations to give out, to websites, Facebook and craigslist postings. The first meeting thanks to a craigslist posting about 20

people were in attendance. Not to shabby! His friend Lonny Langione spoke on basic aquarium keeping while Jay Stephens and Zack Duke sold fish and light refreshments were provided. How amazing to just have people who saw an ad come together to talk fish! Each month followed with a new speaker from Mo Devlin to Kevin J Carr. An auction was added for people wanting to buy and sell their cichlids. Each table had goodies of fish food and info. As the year progressed more and more people found their way through the doors either by social media or word of mouth. Scott even started a club newsletter called Cichlid Chronicles. By the time our one year anniversary came Scott along with the team of Lonny, Christina Smith, Mike Mull, Shane Mell, Wayne Smith and Tonya Kailing had managed to build the club so much that we were honored to have Discus Hans speak! Close to a hundred people from surrounding states along with several members of our sister clubs attended the 1 year anniversary. The club was off and running and a huge success! After the first year it was pretty clear the club needed a larger space. With the help of Wayne Smith The Cichlid Club of York found its new home in Spring Grove at the community center. With the addi-



tional space, a kitchen, storage and a board the sky was the limit! As the club grew so did Scott's vision. The first meeting started with a BANG! With speaker Josh Wiegert and Scotts baby-the first ever Clash of the Cichlids! With about 30 entries the show was a success as well as a learning experience. It was also a lot of fun but also a lot of work. Everything from finding tanks, to getting entries, to trophies was headed by Scott and an ever growing team that now included Kerry Dilks, Orlando Torres and myself.

Soon we were planning a second show. With so many thoughts and ideas after the first show we began to work on the 2nd show. We had shelving built, sponsors for classes, sponsored goodies from fish companies, and our famous spread of food and auction. With our 2nd show we had over 60 entries and we couldn't have been happier. But again hours of work behind the scenes goes into preparing a show of this



This year's show our 3rd installment was our biggest and best yet! Spanning 3 floors of our club house ,it was intense. Adding vendors, raffles, and silent auction, a space dedicated to what can only be described as a feast, separate speaker and auction room. It was a full day and a packed house with months of planning and organizing preceding it.



Each meeting requires so much work and planning. From setting up, to clean up, to food, to organizing speakers and auction. Webpage and Facebook updates, newsletters, auction prepping, paperwork, so much energy, effort and love goes into a meeting/event or trip. It is in a lot of ways a thankless job that each of us volunteer our time to do because we love this club. 




